### Foreign Office, Berlin,

#### March 23, 1897. is Note of the 11th insta

In continuation of his Note of the 11th instant, the undersigned has the honour to inform His Excellency Sir Frank C. Lascelles, Her Britannic Majesty's Ambassador, that according to information received from Governments of the Maritime States of the Empire, goods of the nature mentioned in the Imperial Decree of the 8th of February last (Reichsgesetzblatt, page 15), which left India before the outbreak of the plague, and have since been warehoused in Great Britain, are admitted for importation in the non-Prussian Ports of the Empire, on condition that a certificate from the Imperial German Consul from whose district in Great Britain the goods are exported, or a certificate from the Police Authorities of the district concerned legalized by the Imperial Consul, is produced to show that the above suppositions apply to consignment of goods in question.

In Bremen certificates of the Customs Authorities of the place of origin (? in Great Britain) are accepted, provided that they are legalized by the German Consul; and in Hamburg all other credible proof, such for instance as a declaration of the owner of the warehouse in Great Britain, certified by the German Consul, is considered sufficient to allow of permission to import the goods being granted.

And the series of Broads known as Ormesby, Rollesby, Hemsby, Filby, and Burgh Broads, and the rands, skirts, and walls thereof, and the dykes communicating therewith, and the fens, reed grounds, and low-lying lands, marshes, and pas-tures adjacent thereto, including Lady Broad or Hard Fen Water, in the parish of Filby, Brandyke Broad, in the parish of Burgh St. Margaret, and Muckfleet Dyke, and the marshes and low-lying lands and pastures near or adjacent thereto respectively.

2. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited for a period of one year from the 1st day of May. 1897, within the following areas, viz. :- The whole of the foreshore, including the shingle, sand-hills, saltmarshes, creeks, and other unenclosed lands extending from high-water mark to the first boundary of enclosed or cultivated land separating the foreshore from them, from the Estuary Sluice at North Wootton to the eastern boundary of the parish of Cley-next-the-Sea.

THE Board of Trade in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the 153rd and 154th sections of the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, and with the concurrence of the Treasury, have as from the date of this Notice abolished the offices of Official Assignee, Provisional and Official Assignee of the Estates and Effects of Insolvent Debtors, and Receiver of the Insolvent Debtors' Court, hitherto held by Mr. Peter Paget, and the office of Messenger in Bankruptcy, hitherto held by Mr. John Charles Austin; and they have appointed Mr. Edwin Leadam Hough, one of the Official Receivers in Bankruptcy attached to the High Court, to perform the remaining duties of the offices of Official Assignee, Provisional and Official Assignce of the Estates and Effects of Insolvent Debtors, and Receiver of the Insolvent Debtors' Court.
