THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Berlin, enclosing the following communication from the German Foreign Office with respect to Quarantine, viz. :--

(Translation.)

Foreign Office, Berlin,

March 23, 1897.

In continuation of his Note of the 11th instant, the undersigned has the honour to inform His Excellency Sir Frank C. Lascelles, Her Britannic Majesty's Ambassador, that according to information received from Governments of the Maritime States of the Empire, goods of the nature mentioned in the Imperial Decree of the 8th of February last (Reichsgesetzblatt, page 15), which left India before the outbreak of the plague, and have since been warehoused in Great Britain, are admitted for importation in the non-Prussian Ports of the Empire, on condition that a certificate from the Imperial German Consul from whose district in Great Britain the goods are exported, or a certificate from the Police Authorities of the district concerned legalized by the Imperial Consul, is produced to show that the above suppositions apply to consignment of goods in question.

In Bremen certificates of the Customs Authorities of the place of origin (? in Great Britain) are accepted, provided that they are legalized by the German Consul; and in Hamburg all other credible proof, such for instance as a declaration of the owner of the warehouse in Great Britain, certified by the German Consul, is considered sufficient to allow of permission to import the goods being granted.
