Application of Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896.

1.—(1.) From and after the commencement of this Order, the provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896 dated the eleventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six shall, except as hereinafter provided, apply to the Districts of Local Authorities defined in the Schedule to this Order.

(2.) The said provisions shall not apply to any part of the said Districts which for the time being may be declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Suspected Zone or may be included in any such Zone.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.
