This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by several Orders made by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, of which the earliest was made on the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and the most recent was made on the eighteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, the persons hereinafter called the Civil Service Commissioners, thereby respectively appointed to be Her Majesty's Commissioners for testing, in conformity with Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, or such further Order or Orders, as Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, has issued or may issue in that behalf, the qualifications of persons proposed to be appointed to situations or employments in Her Majesty's Civil Establishments, were likewise appointed Her Majesty's Commissioners for testing, in conformity with regulations to be, from time to time, issued by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for War, the literary qualifications of candidates for first Commissions in the Army, and for admission to the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich

And whereas, it is deemed expedient to transfer from the Secretary of State for War to the Civil Service Commissioners, the conduct of the preliminary arrangements connected with the competitive examinations for admission to the Royal Military College at Sandhurst, and the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich, and the literary examination of University candidates for Commissions in Her Majesty's Army :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that in making the Regulations for determining the eligibility of University candidates for admission to the Army, and of candidates for admission to the Royal Military College, and the Royal Military Academy respectively, the Secretary of State for War shall have the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, for the time being, in matters relating to the educational tests and examinations.

It shall be the duty of the Civil Service Commissioners to ascertain, in accordance with Regulations issued by the Secretary of State for War, that each candidate is duly qualified in respect of age and character, and no University candidate for a Commission in the Army, and no candidate for admission to the Royal Military College or the Royal Military Academy shall be eligible for admission thereto, until the said Commissioners shall have reported to the Secretary of State for War that the candidate is duly qualified as aforesaid.

It is also hereby ordered, that no candidate for a Commission in the Army, who may be successful at a competitive examination, shall be accepted, unless he fulfils in all respects the conditions which may, from time to time, be laid down in Regulations issued by the Secretary of State for War. And whereas by an Order dated the 8th day of December, 1882, the Secretary of State for the Home Department directed that this prohibition should extend only to the period between the 15th day of March and the 1st day of August in each year.

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and for special reasons which have been placed before me in an application from the County Council of the County of Essex, do hereby make the following Orders :-

Nightingale, Goldfinch, Lark, Nightjar, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted-Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Kingfisher, Cuckoo, Barn Owl, Tawny Owl, Long Eared Owl, Short Eared Owl, Kestrel, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Merlin, Hobby, Osprey, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird), Swallow, Sand Martin, House Martin, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Shirks, Deated in Riccounty of Record Incasanty, Shirkes, Magpie, Wheatear, Stonechat, Whin-chat, Red Start, Fly Catchers, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Black Cap, Garden Warbler, Wood Warbler, Willow Warbler, Chiff Chaff, White Throat, Lesser White Throat, Long Tailed Tit, Nuthatch, Wren, Golden Crested Wren, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Hawfinch, Linnet, Common Bunting, Snow Bunting, Landrail or Corncrake, Coot, Chaffinch, Tree Creeper.

2. I hereby exempt the whole County of Essex from the above Order except the portion lying within the Metropolitan Police District and also the parishes of Epping, Epping Upland, Theydon . Bois, Theydon Garnon, and Lambourne. 3. The time during which the taking and

killing of Wild Birds is prohibited within the County of Essex shall be extended so as to be from the 15th day of March to the 15th day of August in each year, both days inclusive.
