**PRESENTATIONS.**

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at the Drawing Room is restricted to those

Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by several Orders made by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, of which the earliest was made on the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and the most recent was made on the eighteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, the persons hereinafter called the Civil Service Commissioners, thereby respectively appointed to be Her Majesty's Commissioners for testing, in conformity with Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, or such further Order or Orders, as Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, has issued or may issue in that behalf, the qualifications of persons proposed to be appointed to situations or employments in Her Majesty's Civil Establishments, were likewise appointed Her Majesty's Commissioners for testing, in conformity with regulations to be, from time to time, issued by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for War, the literary qualifications of candidates for first Commissions in the Army, and for admission to the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich:

And whereas, it is deemed expedient to transfer from the Secretary of State for War to the Civil Service Commissioners, the conduct of the preliminary arrangements connected with the competitive examinations for admission to the Royal Military College at Sandhurst, and the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich, and the literary examination of University candidates for Commissions in Her Majesty's Army:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that in making the Regulations for determining the eligibility of University candidates for admission to the Army, and of candidates for admission to the Royal Military College, and the Royal Military Academy respectively, the Secretary of State for War shall have the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, for the time being, in matters relating to the educational tests and examinations.

It shall be the duty of the Civil Service Commissioners to ascertain, in accordance with Regulations issued by the Secretary of State for War, that each candidate is duly qualified in respect of age and character, and no University candidate for a Commission in the Army, and no candidate for admission to the Royal Military College or the Royal Military Academy shall be eligible for admission thereto, until the said Commissioners shall have reported to the Secretary of State for War that the candidate is duly qualified as aforesaid.

It is also hereby ordered, that no candidate for a Commission in the Army, who may be successful at a competitive examination, shall be accepted, unless he fulfils in all respects the conditions which may, from time to time, be laid down in Regulations issued by the Secretary of State for War.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Berlin, intimating that in future articles specified in the Imperial Order of the 8th February last, which have been shipped in India before the outbreak of the plague and have since been warehoused in England, will be admitted into Prussian ports on condition that proof of the above is provided under the certificate of the local Imperial Consul, or the attestation of the police officials or Chamber of Commerce in the port of lading, certified by the Consul, and that in the case of untanned, air dried hides there is naturally no

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

##### *Extent and Enforcement.*

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the part of a District of a Local Authority mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be enforced by the Local Authority of such District.

##### *Muzzling of Dogs.*

2.—(1.) No dog shall be allowed to be in or on any public place unless such dog is efficiently muzzled with a wire cage muzzle so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent such dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

(2.) Provided that the provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a.) packs of hounds or greyhounds while being exercised or used for sporting purposes, or other sporting dogs while being used for sporting purposes, or any dogs while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin, and in every case in charge of competent persons.

(b.) dogs while being taken to or from exhibitions, shows, or other places if such dogs are confined in boxes, cages, crates, baskets, or hampers so constructed as to render it impossible for such dogs while so confined to bite any person or animal.

##### *Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Unmuzzled Dogs.*

3.—(1.) Any dog found in or on any public

place, without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:

(i.) If the dog is diseased or suspected or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii.) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii.) In any other case the dog shall be detained in some proper place and be there kept for such period as the Local Authority think expedient: Provided that where the person having charge of or the owner of a dog so detained is known, the Local Authority shall cause notice to be forthwith given to such person or owner of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of this Order, be given up to such person or owner on payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such detention. If the dog so seized and detained has not been claimed by such person or owner within three days after the seizure, or, where such person or owner is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority may cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deem expedient.

(2.) Every dog shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

##### *General Provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897.*

4. Subject to the provisions of this Order, all the provisions of the Rabies Order of 1897 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to apply, during the continuance of this Order, to the part of a District to which this Order applies.

##### *Offences.*

5. If any dog is found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person allowing the same to be in or on such public place in contravention of this Order, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

##### *Existing Muzzling Regulations of Local Authority.*

7. All Regulations made under any Order of the Board by the Local Authority of the part of a District mentioned in the Schedule to this



Order which provide for the muzzling of dogs, and are in force immediately before the commencement of this Order, shall, as regards the part of a District to which this Order for the time being applies, be suspended and cease to apply to such part of a District so long as this Order applies thereto.

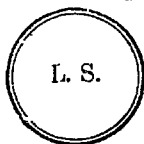
