#### TRUCK ACT, 1896.

IN pursuance of section 1 of "The Rules Publication Act, 1893," notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of forty days from the publication of this notice, to make an order under section 9 of "The Truck Act 1896," granting an exemption from the provisions of the Act in respect of persons engaged in iron ore mines and limestone quarries in the Furness or detached part of Lancashire, and in the Millom Urban District in the county of Cumberland, and in ironstone mines in the North Riding of Yorkshire.

WHEREAS by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," the killing or taking of any kind of Wild Bird during the period between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in any year was prohibited:

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's

Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and for special reasons which have been placed before me in an application from the Gloucestershire County Council, do hereby make the following Orders:-

1. During the period from the 1st day of August in any year to the 1st day of March following, the taking or killing of the following kinds of Wild Bird is prohibited throughout the

County of Gloucester :-

Goldfinch, Long Eared Owl, Ring Ouzel. Water Ouzel, Kingfisher, Stone Curlew, Nightjar, Buzzards, Woodlark, Siskin, Great Grey Shrike, Bittern, Great Snipe (Solitary Snipe), Cirl Bunting

2. The time during which the taking or killing of the following kinds of Wild Bird is probibited within the County of Gloucester shall be extended so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 1st day of November in any year :-

Redpole, Hoopoe, Short Eared Owl, Wood-

3. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Bird is prohibited throughout the County of Gloucester, viz.:-

Dipper (Water Ouzel), Cirl Bunting, Ring Ouzel, Grasshopper Warbler, Wood Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Heron, Woodcock.

#### RIVERS POLLUTION PREVENTION ACT, 1876.

DETERMINING LIMIT OF STREAM.

Borough of Christchurch. To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Christchurch;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of the Rivers Pollution Prevention Act, 1876, it is declared that in the Act the word "stream" includes the sea to such extent, the tidal waters to such point, as may, after local Inquiry and on sanitary grounds, be determined by the Local Government Board by Order published in the London Gazette; and that, save as aforesaid, it includes rivers, streams, canals, lakes, and watercourses, other than watercourses at the passing of that Act mainly used as sewers, and emptying directly into the sea or tidal waters which have not been determined to be streams within the meaning of that Act by such Order as aforesaid.

And whereas application having been made to Us, the Local Government Board, to determine how much of the tidal waters of the Rivers Avon and Stour shall be deemed to be a "stream" within the meaning of the Act above cited, We directed local Inquiry to be made on the subject, and such Inquiry has been held, and a Report has been made to Us thereon.

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In Notices of Dissolution of Partnership the signatures of the Partners are not charged for.
