THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1894. WALSALL FAIRS.

THE Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, that by Memorial, dated the 15th day of May, 1897, a representation has been duly made to him by the Walsall Rural District Council, that the following Fairs have been annually held in the Walsall Rural District, in the county of Stafford:—

The Rushall Wake Fair, held on the Monday falling on or nearest to the 16th day of October;

The Aldridge Wake Fair, held on the Monday falling on or nearest to the 16th day of September;

The Pelsall Wake Fair, held on the Monday falling on or nearest to the 29th day of September;

and that it would be for the convenience and

advantage of the public that such Fairs should in future be held on the Tuesday following the first Monday in August in each year.

On the 19th day of July, 1897, the Secretary of State will take such representation into consideration, and any person who may desire to object to the alteration of the dates for holding the Fairs, should intimate his objections to the Secretary of State before that day.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.
