Plimeuth and Centurion, but apprehending what we were, bore away to the Leeward; in passing by, Sir Clouefly shot down his Main-yard, nevertheless, being got among the Rocks, where we could not come at him, he clcaped. There were in all about 30 small Vessels and 3 Convoys; 6 or 7 were taken by our Snips; the Bridget Gally chased one ashoar, and burnt her, the reit with their two Convoys, got into the Harbor. The Conturions Pinnace took two Fishing-Boats; and some days after we took several The Centurions Pinnace took two Vessels that were going with Provisions to the French Flect.

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Piemouth, Aug. 9. On the 7th Instant the Fleet, under the Command of Admiral Ruffel, passed by this Port for Torbay, where they now are to take on Board Water and Provisions; after which they will immediately return to Sea again. The Tenders with Provisions that Sailed from hence on the 3d instant, have joined the Fleet. We hear that the French Fleet is gone again into Brest, having made it their Business ever siace they were out, to avoid our Fleet, who have been looking for them on their own Coasts.

London, Aug. 12. The East-India Company have by Letters of the 15th and 15th of September latt, from their President at Fort St. George, and Mr. Tromas Yale their Chief at Tegnopatam, received advice; That the Mogue's Governors up in the Coast of Coronandel, the Coast of Gingerat Tiguopatam, received advice; That the Mogui's Governors up in the Coast of Chromandel, the Coast of Gingerles, in Bengal, and in all other places in India, do most exactly comply with the Articles of Peace lately made between the Great Moguland the English General at Benbay, since deceased. That Rama Ranab King of the Chingee and Carnatta Countries, had so d the Inheritance of Tignopatam, a very considerable Fort and Town, with some Teritories and Villages thereunto belonging, unto the shid Company, and granted them great Phivideiges in his his and Countries: That the Company were accordingly in actual possession thereof, and that an addition of 30 Guns with suitable Ammunition, and 100 European Soldiers besides Gunners and Black People, had been sent thither, to secure the possession of it, being a place of great Consequence for the surre Benefit of this Kingdom. The King's Phirmaund for the Sale of the said fort and Territories, is to this effect; Trat Hz, the faid King of Chingee, has, out of his Royal Love and Friendship to the said Company and their Nation, sold and granted unto them, and in Consideration of Forty Teo sland Chunkuraes, which he thereby acknowledges to have received, does for himself, his Heirs and Succission, field and granted unto them, and in Consideration of Forty Teo sland fully give and make over to the said Succission, with all the Ground Moods and Revers round the find Fort mith all the Ground, Moods and Revers round the find Fort mith all the Ground, Moods and Revers round the Ground within the faid Companies proper and rightful Possesson, with all the Ground, Moods and Revers round the Ground mithin the faid Limits, to copp Money, and Govern according to their own Laws. And finally, promises to defend them in the Possesson have facered against the French, and all other European Nations what-solvers.

It is further advised. That the said French Men of War took afterwards their course towards Palitecherry, and in their way to Ceylon took two small Dutch Ships: At Pallicherry they Victualled and fitted in July, which the Dutch Governor of Pollicat, who was on that Coast with five Ships having notice of, he failto Fort St. George for protection, which was readily granted him, and the English Ships the Defence, Recovery and Rebuca, being then in that Road, were immediately put

into the best posture of desence, and assistance of the Dutch.
