2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of September, one thousand

eight hundred and ninety-seven.

Tranekiær Light-Intended Alteration in Character.

THE Danish Government has given notice that, during the year 1897, the undermentioned alteration will be made in the character of Tranekiær Light :-

Tranekiær Light will be a group-flashing white light with a period of twenty seconds, showing three flashes in quick succession, thus: flash half a second, eclipse three and a half seconds, flash half a second, eclipse three and a half seconds, flash half a second, eclipse eleven and a half seconds. It is elevated 45 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles.

No. 566,—FRANCE—SOUTH COAST. Antibes - Alteration in Character of Garoupe Light.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 450 of 1897:

The French Government has given further notice, that on 15th September, 1897, Garoupe Light was altered from fixed white to a catadioptric group-flashing white light with a period of ten seconds, thus: - flash, half a second; eclipse, two seconds; flash, half a second; eclipse, seven seconds.

No. 568.—UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. Amended Inland Rules of the Road to be Followed in Certain Ports and Water Areas.

WITH reference to Hydrographic Notice No. 6 of 1897 :-

Information has been received from the United States Government that on and after 7th October, 1897, the rules of the road for inland waters will be similar to the International Rules which came into force on 1st July last, with the following exceptions :-

ART. 4 is entirely omitted.

ART. 7 is omitted excepting the paragraph-

"Rowing boats, whether under oars or sails, shall have ready at hand a lantern showing a white light, which shall be temporarily exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision.'

ART. 9 (a).—Relating to fishing-vessels as follows :- Fishing-vessels of less than ten gross tons, when under way and when not having their nets, trawls, dredges, or lines in the water, shall not be obliged to carry the coloured side-lights; but every such vessel shall, in lieu thereof, have ready at hand a lantern with a green glass on one side and a red glass on the other, and on approaching to or being approached by another vessel, such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard said.

(b.) All fishing-vessels and fishing-boats of ten gross tons or upwards, when under way and not having their nets, trawls, dredges, or lines in the water, shall carry and show the same lights as vessels under way.

(c.) All vessels, when trawling, dredging, or

fishing with any kind of drag-nets or lines, shall exhibit from some part of the vessel where they can be best seen, two lights; one of these lights shall be red and the other shall be white. red light shall be above the white light, and shall be at a vertical distance from it of not less than six feet and not more than twelve feet; and the horizontal distance, if any, shall not be more than ten feet. These two lights shall be of such a character, and contained in lanterns of such construction as to be visible all round the horizon, the white light a distance of not less than three miles, and the red light a distance of not less than two miles.

(d.) Rafts or other water craft not herein provided for, navigated by hand power, horse power, or by current of the river, shall carry one or more good white lights, which shall be placed in such manner as shall be prescribed by the Board of Supervising Inspectors of steam-vessels.

ART.—15. (a.) is amended as follows:—A steam-vessel under way shall sound, at intervals of not more than one minute, a prolonged blast.

(e.) A steam-vessel when towing, shall, instead of the signals prescribed in subdivision (a) of this article, at intervals of not more than one minute, sound three blasts in succession, namely, one prolonged blast followed by two short blasts. A vessel towed may give this signal and she shall not give any other.

(f.) All rafts, or other water craft, not herein provided for, navigated by hand power, horse power, or by the current of the river, shall sound a blast of the fog-horn, or equivalent signal, at

intervals of not more than one minute.

ART. 18. - When steam-vessels are approaching each other end on or nearly so, it shall be the duty of each to pass on the port side of the other; and either vessel shall give, as a signal of her intention, one short and distinct blast of her whistle, which the other vessel shall answer promptly by a similar blast of her whistle, and thereupon such vessels shall pass on the port side of each other. But if the courses of such vessels are so far on the starboard of each other as not to be considered as meeting end on, either vessel shall immediately give two short and distinct blasts of her whistle, which the other vessel shall answer promptly by two similar blasts of her whistle, and they shall pass on the starboard side of each other.

If when steam-vessels are approaching each other, either vessel fails to understand the course or intention of the other, from any cause, the vessel so in doubt shall immediately signify the same by giving several short and rapid blasts, not

less than four, of the steam whistle.

Whenever a steam-vessel is nearing a short bend or curve in the channel, where, from the height of the banks or other cause, a steamvessel approaching from the opposite direction, cannot be seen for a distance of half a mile, such steam-vessel, when she shall have arrived within half a mile of such curve or bend, shall give a signal by one long blast of the steamwhistle, which signal shall be answered by a similar blast, given by any approaching steam-vessel that may be within hearing. Should such signal be so answered by a steam-vessel upon the farther side of such bend, then the usual signal for meeting and passing shall immediately be given and answered; but if the first alarm signal of such vessel be not answered, she is to consider the channel clear and govern herself accordingly.

When steam-vessels are moved from their docks or berths and other boats are liable to pass from any direction toward them, they shall

give the same signal as in case of vessels meeting at a bend, but immediately after clearing the berths so as to be fully in sight they shall be governed by the steering and sailing rules.

When steam-vessels are running in the same direction, and the vessel which is astern shall desire to pass on the right or starboard hand of the vessel ahead, she shall give one short blast of the steam-whistle as a signal of such desire, and if the vessel ahead answers with one blast she shall put her helm to port; or if she shall desire to pass on the left or port side of the vessel ahead, she shall give two short blasts of the steam-whistle as a signal of such desire, and if the vessel ahead answers with two blasts, shall put her helm to starboard; or if the vessel ahead does not think it safe for the vessel astern to attempt to pass at that point, she shall immediately signify the same by giving several short and rapid blasts of the steam-whistle not less than four, and under no circumstances shall the vessel astern attempt to pass the vessel ahead until such time as they have reached a point where it can be safely done, when said vessel ahead shall signify her willingness by blowing the proper signals. The vessel ahead shall in no case attempt to cross the bow or crowd upon the course of the passing vessel.

The whistle signals provided in the rules under this article for steam-vessels meeting, passing, or overtaking are never to be used except when steamers are in sight of each other, and the course and position of each can be determined in the daytime by a sight of the vessel itself, or by night by seeing the signal lights. In fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rainstorms, when vessels cannot see each other, fog signals only must be

ART. 30. The exhibition of any light on board a vessel of war of the United States or a revenue cutter may be suspended whenever, in the opinion of the Secretary of the Navy, the Commander-in-Chief of a squadron, or the Commander of a vessel acting singly, the special character of the Service shall require it.
