Palmouth , June 8. 4 ,, He 6th instant arrived here the Indian Merchant in 10 weeks from Jamaica, bound for London, informing us that the Plantation there is in a very prosperous and thriving condition. The same day came in also two great French Ships of about 300 Tuns a piece from Haure de Grace, belonging to the Grand Partie and bound for Rochelle to lade Salt; and one oth r thip belonging to the Bank intended for Diepe.

Newcatle, June 9. Since the going out of the Laden Fleet, are arrived here about 80 (ail of light ships, and about

50 more are put into Sunderland.

Lisbon, fure 2 The French forces which were during the rate War with Spain, emploied here in the service of this Crown, on the 29th past embarked upon four French Men of War and about a dozen Merchant thips, which have been some weeks attending for them; the next day the Count de Schomberg went also aboard, and yesterday set fail for France, but inten ling to make some little flay in Cafcayes Road.

The Cortes having taken into their confideration the neceffary expenses which must of necessity fall upon the Crown for the maintenance of forces in convenient Garrifons during the time of Peace, have confented to raife yearly the furn of 400 thousand Crowns by a Land Taxe, for the defraying of that Charge; with which the Prince has declared his fatisfaction; and its believed the Cortes may in

little time be dismist.

Don Rodrige Mencfes and the Duke de Cadavall, who for some time had retired them elves, have upon the Princes Letters returned to the Court. The Officers of the Army which were lately discharged from their several Commands, with the Governours of leveral di mantled Garrisons, have honourable provisions made for their botter sublistance, to their great satisfaction; and much care is taken for the resettlement of the Trade of this Kingdome.

Legorne, June 4. The 30th past arrived here the French Fleet, confishing of 12 Men of War, 2 Fireships, and one Hoy, commanded by the Marquis de Martell their Vice-Admiral, wearing his Flagg; and was first saluted by the Castle with 5 Guns, which he returned with the ike number : after which the Castle gave him 5 more with 12 Chambers, which be answered again from his own thip; they give out that they expect new O ders here, and that the Gallies may be also suddenly expected.

From Firence we are told that the young Prince of Tufe cany intends to spend some more time in viewing foreign parts, and is inclined particularly to visit England and

France.

From Candia they tell us that the Turks Army daily increases, as does also the thrength of the Venetians; so that we may shortly hear of action 5 the Visier being resolved to

employ all his art and industry against that City.

Hambourgh, June 8. The Field-Here Wrangle is now said to be prived at Wolgass, where he may continue some few dayes, and from thence pass into the Dutchy of Bremen, where he is earnestly expected by the souldiers, hoping at his return to receive the arrears of pay which are due to them.
