

great numbers quartered near these parts, are embarked upon 60 Billanders, and are to pass towards *Brussels* and *Amsterdam*. The Plague is lately broken out in several Villages near *Blackenberg*; it rages with much violence at *Doway*, and is said to be encreased at *Brussels*; but much care is every where taken to prevent the further spreading of it. The Marquis de *Castel-Rodrigo* is busily compleating the Fortifications at *Brussels*, where he employs daily about 800 men, and 'tis said a Citadel is designed to be built there.

Paris, June 20. Letters from *Franch Comte* tell us that Monsieur de *Badagne* being informed of the Conclusion and Publication of the Peace in this City, immediately ruined the remainder of the Fortifications in that County, and took down the Bells from their Towers, lest they might for the future be turned into Cannon.

His Majesty is speedily dispatching away an Ambassador to the Republick of *Venice*, and 'tis said has made choice of the President de *St. Andre* of the Parliament of *Grenoble* for the Employment. For his Divertisement at *St. Germain* he has ordered all the Companies of his Household both Horse and Foot, to encampe their lives near that place, where they are to continue the greater part of this Summer, and to be frequently exercised.

The Count d' *Erades* lately Ambassadour from His Majesty to the States General of the *United Provinces*, is newly arrived here from that Embassy.

The Duke de *Chaulnes*, our Ambassadour in the Court of *Rome*, has by his Letters informed His Majesty, that the Pope hath been solicited by the Queen of *Spain* for a Cardinal's Hat to be conferred on her Confessor, which is not yet granted; it being not customary for the Popes to oblige the Crowns by such promotions, before the third year of their Pontificate; which yet His Holiness is willing to dispence with, if His Majesty please to commend any person to him whom he shall judge worthy of that Dignity. The Pope has also by him returned many thanks to His Majesty for the liberty given him to take down the Pillar erected in *Rome* in memory of the affront given by the Cortes of the Popes Guard to the late Ambassadour during the life of the Pope his Predecessor.
