Act, 1880," is hereby repealed.

5. Except in the Hundred of Amounderness and that portion of the county of Lancaster known as Lonsdale South of the Sands "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply throughout the Administrative County of Lancaster to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:

Song Thrush, Blackbird, Greater White Throat, Lesser White Throat, Sedge Warbler, Reed Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Heron.
