ON the 27th instant, Her Royal Highness The Princess Mary Adelaide, Duchess of Teck, First Cousin to The Queen, departed this life, at Her residence, The White Lodge, Richmond Park, to the great grief of Her Majesty, and of the Royal Family.

ORDERS for the Court's going into Mourning on Thursday, the 28th instant, for Her late Royal Highness The Princess Mary Adelaide, Duchess of Teck, First Cousin to Her Majesty The Queen, viz. :—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, white Gloves, black or white Shoes, Feathers, and Fans, Pearls, Diamonds, or plain gold or silver Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to wear black Court Dress, with black Swords and Buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning on Thursday, the 11th November next, viz. :—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, with coloured Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments, or grey or white Dresses, with black Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to continue the same Mourning.

And on Thursday, the 18th November, the Court to go out of Mourning.

ORDERS for the Mourning of Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines for Her late Royal Highness the Princess Mary Adelaide, Duchess of Teck.

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have received Her Majesty's commands to direct, on the present melancholy occasion of the death

of Her Royal Highness Princess Mary Adelaide, Duchess of Teck, First Cousin of Her Majesty the Queen, that the Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines be required to wear, when in uniform, a band of black crape round the left arm, as prescribed by the Regulations.

The Mourning will be continued until the 7th November, inclusive.
