ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 22ND NOVEMBER 1897.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896 and the Order described in the Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

No. 704.—CHINA.

Typhoon and Storm Warnings.

THE Chinese Government has given notice, dated 15th July, 1897, that the undermentioned signals of the International Code will be shown, as typhoon and storm warnings, at the semaphores of the ports receiving telegraphic warnings of typhoons or storms, on and after 1st January, 1898:—

The letter V added to a typhoon signal signifies

that the centre is in the immediate vicinity of the place indicated by the Code:—

Number of Signal.	Typhoons. Signification.
10	Typhoon to S.E. of Luzon.
11	Typhoon to S. of Luzon.
12	Typhoon to S.W. of Luzon.
13	Typhoon to E. of Luzon.
14	Typhoon over central Luzon.
15	Typhoon to W. of Luzon.
16	Typhoon to N.E. of Luzon.
17	Typhoon to N. of Luzon.
18	Typhoon to N.W. of Luzon.
