(Acquisition of Site.)

(Power to Commissioners of Her Majesty's Works to acquire Lands at Barry Dock; Powers to Commissioners as to Sale and Disposal of Lands).

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next Session for an Act to authorise the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Works and Public Buildings (hereinafter called "the Commissioners") to acquire by compulsory purchase, or otherwise, certain lands (in which term houses and buildings are included), hereinafter described, for the purpose of erecting thereon customs, mercantile marine, and other public offices and buildings, that is to say:—

Certain lands in the parish of Cadoxton-juxta-Barry, in the county of Glamorgan, belonging or reputed to belong to Mrs. Laura Frances Jenner and her trustees, bounded on the east by lands in the same ownership, on the west by Station-street, on the north by a lane leading from Kingsland-crescent to Station-street, and on the south by Dock View-road;

and the said intended Act will empower the Commissioners to stop up and discontinue all roads, footways, sewers, drains, mains, and

works within the respective area, so to be acquired as aforesaid, and will authorise the Commissioners to sell and dispose of such part of any of the lands so acquired by them as may not be required for the purposes of the intended Act.

And the intended Act will confer powers to vary or extinguish all or any existing rights and privileges in any manner connected with the lands so to be acquired as aforesaid, and all such other powers, rights, and privileges as may be necessary, proper, or convenient, for carrying into effect the objects and purposes of the intended Act.

And notice is hereby also given, that, on or before the 30th of November instant, plans describing the situation of the lands so to be acquired by the Commissioners, a book of reference to such plans, and a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Glamorgan, at his office at Cardiff, and with the Clerk of the Urban District Council of Cadoxton-juxta-Barry, at his office.
