The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the forty-seventh and forty-eighth years of Her Majesty chapter sixty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the forty-seventh and forty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the district of Saint Luke West Hampstead in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the sixth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six and published in the London Gazette upon the tenth day of the same month ratifying a scheme of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England prepared under the provisions of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven certain portions of the parish of Saint John Hampstead and of the new parish of Emmanuel West End Hampstead both in the said county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London aforesaid were together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and the same was called ‘The District of Saint Luke West Hampstead.’

“ And whereas there is not yet within the existing limits of the said district of Saint Luke West Hampstead a consecrated church.

“ And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said district should be altered by way of extension so that they shall include the additional portions hereinafter described of the said parish of Saint John Hampstead and of the said new parish of Emmanuel West End Hampstead.

“ Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Mandell Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said district of Saint Luke West Hampstead shall be altered by way of extension so that they shall include all those additional portions of the said parish of Saint John Hampstead and of said new parish of Emmanuel West End Hampstead which are described in the First and Second Schedules hereunder written and are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto appended and are thereon coloured pink and green respectively and that from and after the said day of publication as aforesaid and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portions of the said parish of Saint John Hampstead and of the said new parish of Emmanuel West End Hampstead so to be included within the boundaries of the district of Saint Luke West Hampstead as aforesaid shall become and be and form part of the same district.

“ And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or of any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The FIRST SCHEDULE.

“ The territory (a portion of the parish of Saint John Hampstead in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London) to be annexed to the district of Saint Luke West Hampstead in the same county and diocese being:—

“ All that portion of the said parish of Saint John Hampstead which is bounded upon the south-west by the said district of Saint Luke West Hampstead upon the north-west by the new parish

of All Saints Child's Hill Hendon in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints Child's Hill Hendon from the parish of Saint John Hampstead aforesaid at a point in the middle of Child's Hill-lane a little to the west of its junction with Platt's-lane and with Rosecroft-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said Child's Hill-lane for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its junction with Platt's-lane and with Rosecroft-road as aforesaid and extending thence south-eastward to and along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the point, where the same road bends towards the south, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint John Hampstead from the district of Saint Luke West Hampstead aforesaid.

"The SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be discovered from the new parish of Emmanuel West End Hampstead in the county and diocese aforesaid and to be annexed to the district of Saint Luke West Hampstead aforesaid being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Emmanuel West End Hampstead which is bounded upon the north-west and upon the north-east by the said district of Saint Luke West Hampstead and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-east and upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said district of Saint Luke West Hampstead from the new parish of Emmanuel West End Hampstead aforesaid at the junction of Ajax-road with Achilles-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Agamemnon-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises numbered 64 Agamemnon-road from the adjacent stables and extending thence north-westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence joins the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of Hampstead Cemetery upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Emmanuel West End Hampstead from the district of Saint Luke West Hampstead aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her present Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said Majesty chapter sixty-three duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the archdeaconry of Middlesex in the diocese of London and to some of the rural deaneries within such archdeaconry.

"Whereas by a Schedule bearing date the ninth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five and prepared in pursuance of the said Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-three and being under the hand and seal of the then Bishop of London the rural deaneries within the said diocese of London were set forth and arranged.

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Mandell Bishop of London that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said archdeaconry of Middlesex and to some of the rural deaneries within such archdeaconry are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect.

"And whereas the said arrangements involve the abolition of the two rural deaneries of Saint James Westminster and of Saint George Bloomsbury and the inclusion of the several parishes or cures comprised within those two rural deaneries within the rural deanery of Saint Martin in the Fields.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Mandell Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the two rural deaneries of Saint James Westminster and of Saint George Bloomsbury shall be abolished and the several parishes or cures or churches hitherto comprised within those two rural deaneries shall be transferred to and shall henceforth form part of the rural deanery of Saint Martin in the Fields aforesaid so that the said rural deanery of Saint Martin in the Fields shall henceforth comprise and consist of the parishes or cures or churches the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of such rural deanery in the Schedule to this scheme annexed and

each of the said parishes or cures or churches shall belong to and be and form part of the said rural deanery of Saint Martin in the Fields and of the said archdeaconry of Middlesex and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the said rural deanery and of the Archdeacon of the said archdeaconry under which it is so set down as aforesaid and shall not belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery or archdeaconry nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or Archdeacon.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

And whereas notice of the said scheme has in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Archdeacon affected by the scheme that is to say, the Archdeacon of Middlesex and he has expressed his approval of the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said

Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the twenty-seventh section of “The Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway Act 1895,” and of the several Acts (or some of them) relating to the said Commissioners referred to in such section duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the twenty-seventh section of ‘The Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway Act 1895’ and of the several Acts (or some of them) relating to us which are referred to in such section, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme relative to the church and new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham in the town and county of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell.

“Whereas in pursuance of the firstly mentioned Act the Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway Company have purchased and taken the site and fabric of the said church at the price and for the sum of six thousand pounds and have also purchased and taken the glebe belonging to the vicarage of the said new parish at the price and for the sum of four thousand pounds and the said sums have been paid to us as directed by the said Act.

“And whereas a site for a new church situate within the limits of the new parish of Hyson Green in the suburbs of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell aforesaid was by a deed dated the twentieth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven conveyed to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and no consecrated church has yet been erected upon such site.

“And whereas it has been proposed to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the new church of Saint Stephen be provided out of the proceeds of the sale of the present church of Saint Stephen Nottingham should be erected upon the site so conveyed to us as aforesaid and that a separate district comprising within its limits the said site for the proposed new church of Saint Stephen aforesaid should be formed out of the said new parish of Hyson Green.

“And whereas the endowments of the said new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham are now represented by a sum of three thousand seven hundred pounds being the balance of the said sum of four thousand pounds after deducting therefrom a sum of three hundred pounds which has been applied in accordance with the Act in liquidating a mortgage on a part of the glebe aforesaid and by annual grants together amounting to two hundred

and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence payable by us out of our common fund.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend George Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and caused his episcopal seal to be attached thereto) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the following arrangements shall be made firstly there shall be set apart towards the cost of building a church upon the site which is situate within the limits of the said new parish of Hyson Green and which has been conveyed to us as aforesaid such a portion of the above mentioned sum of six thousand pounds as will in our opinion be sufficient for the purpose.

"Secondly, that as from the day aforesaid all that part of the said new parish of Hyson Green which is described in the Schedule to this scheme and which is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Stephen Nottingham.'

"Thirdly that the whole right of patronage of the said district, and when the same district shall have become a new parish then of the said new parish shall subject to the provisions contained in the sixth sub-section of the said twenty-seventh section of the firstly mentioned Act vest in and be fully and freely and at all times exercised by the present patrons of the vicarage of the new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham aforesaid.

"Fourthly that as from the day aforesaid there shall be transferred from the said proposed district and new parish the whole of the endowments of the new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham so represented as aforesaid excepting as is hereinafter mentioned.

"Fifthly that the furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint Stephen Nottingham shall be removed stored and dealt with under the superintendence and supervision of the Venerable John Gray Richardson Archdeacon of Nottingham the Reverend Charles Douglas Gordon the vicar of the new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham aforesaid and the churchwardens of the said church of Saint Stephen Nottingham.

"Sixthly that as from the date of the consecration of the new church of Saint Stephen Nottingham aforesaid the whole of the territory now comprised within the said new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham shall be annexed to and shall become and be for all ecclesiastical purposes a part of the contiguous new parish of Saint Mark Nottingham in the said town and county of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell aforesaid.

"Sevently and lastly that as from the last-mentioned date a sum of eight hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eightpence being part of the sum of three thousand and seven hundred pounds remaining as aforesaid out of the said sum of four thousand pounds shall be set apart and held by us as an addition to the endowments of the said new parish of Saint Mark Nottingham.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Stephen Nottingham being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry district) of Hyson Green in the town and county of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell which is bounded upon the north partly by the district or new parish of New Basford and partly by the parish of Basford both in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the north-west by the said parish of Basford upon the west and upon the south-west by the parish of Radford in the said county and diocese and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-east and upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Radford from the new parish of Hyson Green aforesaid at the junction of Alfreton-road with the road called or known as Gregory Boulevard and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Birkin-avenue and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Selhurst-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Radford-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Archer-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Noel-street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Hyson Green from the district or new parish of New Basford aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbent of the said new parish of Hyson Green out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted, shall be taken, and such patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwell.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one

thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parish or parochial chapelry of Ipstones partly out of the parish of Checkley and partly out of the parish of Kingsley all in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield.

“Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Ipstones of the said parish of Checkley and of the parish of Kingsley aforesaid which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

“And whereas we are satisfied that each of the said parishes is a cure wherein, or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the inhabitants thereof.

“And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

“And whereas the Reverend Henry Edward Beech the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Kingsley has contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of four thousand three hundred pounds sterling in aid of the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and (so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then) of the said new parish, and of the maintenance of the minister or incumbent thereof for the time being and we have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year to such minister or incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the said secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act the sum of one hundred and twenty-nine pounds per annum, so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

“And whereas the said capital sum of four thousand three hundred pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the common fund created by the firstly herein named Act a capital sum of seven hundred pounds in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of twenty-one pounds and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter set forth.

“And whereas the said Henry Edward Beech the donor of the said endowment of four thousand three hundred pounds has nominated to us as the persons in whom he desires that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new

parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be alternately vested, Rowland John Beech of Shave Hall Cheadle in the said county of Stafford Esquire and Dryden Henry Sneyd of Ashecombe Park in the same county Esquire their heirs and assigns for ever.

“And whereas the said grant of a capital sum of seven hundred pounds will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us the said Commissioners under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Augustus Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Ipstones of the said parish of Checkley and of the said parish of Kingsley which are described in the Schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Foxt with Whiston.’

“And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be vested in and shall be exercised alternately by the said Rowland John Beech and the said Dryden Henry Sneyd their heirs and assigns for ever the first turn of appointment to be exercised by the said Rowland John Beech.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme has reference.

“The District of Foxt with Whiston comprising all those several contiguous portions of the parish or parochial chapelry of Ipstones, of the parish of Checkley (detached) and of the parish of Kingsley all in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield, which said portions, taken together are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the parish of Alton in the said county and diocese from the parish or parochial chapelry of Ipstones aforesaid at a point on Black Heath otherwise Alton Common in the middle of the road leading from Windy Harbour over the said heath or common to Ipstones Edge and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of sixty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footway or occupation road which leads towards Ipstones Park and extending

thence south-westward along the middle of the said footway or occupation road for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to the point on the eastern side of the house called or known as Park Gate where the same footway or occupation road is joined by the footpath leading from Lower Parkhead to Grimditch otherwise Grimdheath the said point being at or near to the source of the stream which flows through Ipstones Park into Blackbank Brook and extending thence first south-westward and then southward to and along the middle of the said stream for a distance of sixty chains or thereabouts to its junction in Blackbank Wood with Blackbank Brook aforesaid, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said brook for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts (thereby passing through the Mill Pond at Park Mill) to a point at the northern end of Whieldon's Wood upon the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Ipstones from the detached portion of the parish of Checkley aforesaid and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the last-described boundary for a distance of seventy-two chains or thereabouts (thereby continuing to follow generally the course of the said Blackbank Brook) to the point near Froghall Canal Wharf where the said last-described boundary is joined by the boundary dividing the said parish or parochial chapelry of Ipstones from the parish of Kingsley aforesaid and extending thence generally southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing and recrossing the line of the Froghall Mineral Branch of the North Staffordshire Railway) to the point where the same boundary strikes the middle of the River Churnet and extending thence generally southward along the middle of the said river for a distance of one mile and seven chains or thereabouts (thereby following at one part the boundary which divides the said parish of Kingsley from a certain detached portion of the parish of Cheadle in the county and diocese aforesaid) to a point upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Kingsley from the new parish of Oakamoor in the said county and diocese and extending thence along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one mile and sixty-four chains or thereabouts alternately north-eastward and south-eastward (thereby following the course of the River Churnet aforesaid) and then north-eastward along the same boundary for a further distance of one mile and sixty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction at the stream flowing from Upper Cotton through Star Wood to Oakamoor with the boundary which divides the said parish of Kingsley from the parish of Alton aforesaid and extending thence north-westward along the last-described boundary for a distance of one mile and twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction at the stream known as Shirley Brook flowing to and through Shirley Hollow with the boundary which divides the said parish of Alton from the detached portion of the parish of Checkley aforesaid, and extending thence north eastward for a distance of sixty-three chains or thereabouts along the last-described boundary and along the boundary which divides the said parish of Alton from the parish or parochial chapelry of Ipstones as aforesaid to the first-described point on Black Heath or Alton Common in the middle of the road leading from Windy Harbour over Black Heath to Ipstones Edge as aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly

hereinbefore mentioned Act, and of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighteenth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Mark Bolton-le-Moors and out of the District Chapelry of Saint George the Martyr Daubhill both the portions of such new parish and of such district chapelry so to be comprised within the said proposed district being within the original limits of the ancient parish of Bolton-le-Moors in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Bolton-le-Moors and of the said district chapelry of Saint George the Martyr Daubhill which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

And whereas we are satisfied that both the said new parish of Saint Mark, Bolton-le-Moors and the said district chapelry of Saint George the Martyr Daubhill are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof.

"And whereas in pursuance of the power and authority given by an Order and Decree of Your

Majesty's High Court of Chancery bearing date the fourth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight approving a scheme for the regulation and management of the 'Bolton Lectureship Charity Estate' and of certain Orders of the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales bearing date respectively the ninth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one and the twelfth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three amending the said Order and Decree of the fourth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight a clear annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds has been provided out of the revenues of the said estate and is available for and towards the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and for and towards the maintenance of the minister thereof, so soon as such minister shall have been appointed and licensed thereto and of his successors ministers of the same district and when the same district shall have become a new parish then to the minister or incumbent of such new parish.

"And whereas the said annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds is available as aforesaid and has been so provided upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the right of patronage of the said district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and of the nomination of the minister thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the Trustees of the said Bolton Lectureship Charity Estate have nominated to us as the persons to whom they the said Trustees desire that the right of patronage of the said proposed district should be assigned the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever for the first and each and every alternate turn of appointment and themselves the said Trustees and their successors for the second and each and every other alternate turn of appointment.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Mark Bolton-le-Moors and of the said district chapelry of Saint George the Martyr, Daubhill which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and which are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Philip, Bolton-le-Moors.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and the right of nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof for the first and thereafter every alternate turn of presentation or nomination shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever and that such patronage and

right of nomination aforesaid shall for the second and every subsequent alternate turn of presentation or nomination be in like manner assigned to and be absolutely vested in and be from time to time exercised by the said Trustees of the Bolton Lectureship Charity Estate aforesaid and their successors for the time being.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act or Acts of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Philip Bolton-le-Moors, comprising:—

"1. All that portion of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Mark Bolton-le-Moors within the original limits of the ancient parish of Bolton-le-Moors in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which is bounded on the south by the new parish of Saint Michael Great Lever in the county and diocese aforesaid, upon the south-west by the district chapelry of Saint George the Martyr Daubhill in the said county and diocese upon the north-west by that part of the said last-named cure (including the hereinafter described portion thereof) which is within the original limits of the ancient parish of Bolton-le-Moors and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of High-street opposite to the middle of the disused goods line or coal siding of the London and North Western Railway at which point the boundaries of the said district chapelry of Saint George the Martyr Daubhill of the new parish of Emmanuel, Bolton-le-Moors in the county and diocese aforesaid and of the new parish of Saint Mark, Bolton-le-Moors aforesaid all meet and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of High-street aforesaid for a distance of twelve and a half chains or thereabouts to the point where it passes over the Bolton and Kenyon line of the said London and North Western Railway and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the boundary at Tanner Hole Brook which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark Bolton-le-Moors from the new parish of Saint Michael, Great Lever aforesaid.

(2.) And also all that contiguous portion of the said district chapelry of Saint George the Martyr, Daubhill (within the original limits of the ancient parish of Bolton-le-Moors as aforesaid) which is bounded on the south-east by the hereinafter described portion of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Bolton-le-Moors on the north-east by the new parish of Emmanuel, Bolton-le-Moors aforesaid on the north-west partly by the last-named cure and partly by the new parish of Saint Saviour Bolton-le-Moors in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-named cure from the District Chapelry of Saint George the Martyr, Daubhill aforesaid at the point where Derby-street is joined by Goldsmith-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of six and a quarter chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of the same street with Back Auburn-street which boundary divides the

said District Chapelry of Saint George the Martyr, Daubhill from the hereinbefore described portion of the new parish of Saint Mark Bolton-le-Moors aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

And whereas by another Act passed in the

Session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that so much of the Order of Her Majesty in Council of second March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, as affects the parish of Rothbury in the county of Northumberland should be varied by substituting for the directions contained therein the following directions, viz. :—

That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Rothbury, in the county of Northumberland; and also in the old part of the churchyard except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the old churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order, viz. :—widows, widowers, parents, and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

And also in the Church Cemetery, added in one thousand eight hundred and seventy; except as follows :—

(a.) In existing wholly walled graves, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In existing partly walled graves and earthen graves, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces as have never before been buried in and which when opened are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the seventh day of January next.

HINTON, GLOUCESTERSHIRE.—Forthwith and entirely in Hinton Church in the county of Gloucester; and also in those parts of the churchyard which lie to the west, south-west, south and south-east of the church, except as follows :—

GULDEN MORDEN, CAMBRIDGE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Guilden Morden in the county of Cambridge; and also in the churchyard except as follows :—

(a.) In such wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In existing partly walled or earthen graves, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order viz. :— widows and widowers, as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces (limited to twelve in number) now existing in the churchyard, as have never before been buried in which, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

SKIDBY, YORKS.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Skidby, in the county of York; and also in the churchyard except as follows :—

In such reserved grave spaces (limited to ten in number) now existing in the churchyard, as have never before been buried in, which when opened are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

WELLOW, SOMERSET.—Forthwith and entirely in Wellow Church; and also in the churchyard after the thirtieth September one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Poor Law Conferences: Altering Regulations:—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales for the time being:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order dated the 17th day of September, 1883, issued under Section 2 of the Poor Law Conferences Act, 1883, empowered the

Guardians of the Poor of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales to pay the reasonable expenses incurred in attending any Conference of Guardians held for the purpose of discussing any matter connected with the duties which devolve on them; and in purchasing reports of the proceedings of any such Conference, subject to the regulations set forth in such General Order;

And whereas it was provided by paragraph (3) of the said General Order that in the case of the Central Conference held in London only one Guardian should be authorized to attend from any Union situate at a distance of more than fifty miles from the place of meeting:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made in the matter as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Direct that the following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (3) in the said General Order:—

“(3.) The maximum number of Guardians authorized to attend any Conference shall be three, and in the case of the Central Conference held in London two Guardians only shall be authorized to attend from any Union which is situate at a distance of more than fifty miles from the place of meeting.”

ORDER of the Local Government Board under the District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of District and Duties (Supplemental):—
Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District.
Chirk Rural District.

To Sir Richard Dansey Green-Price, Baronet,
District Auditor;—

To the Rural District Council of Chirk;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 7th day of May, 1883, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said Richard Dansey Green-Price as a District Auditor, and ordered and prescribed that the District in which he should in future act as Auditor, and which was thereby assigned to him, should, until We should otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, and that such District should be termed “The Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District”;

And whereas it is prescribed by Article II of the said Order that it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Guardians and the Overseers specified in Nos. (1) and (2) of that Article, as well as the

Accounts of the other Authorities (and of their Officers) referred to in Nos. (3) and (4) in the following terms:—

“(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within the said Audit District.

“(4.) Such of the said other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within the said Audit District, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.”

And whereas the Rural District Council of Chirk is an Authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and the District of the said Rural District Council is partly situated within the said Audit District:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Richard Dansey Green-Price to audit the Accounts of the said Rural District Council, and of the Officers of that Council, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article III of the above-cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the District of the said Rural District Council shall be deemed to be within the said Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District.
