

each of the said parishes or cures or churches shall belong to and be and form part of the said rural deanery of Saint Martin in the Fields and of the said archdeaconry of Middlesex and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the said rural deanery and of the Archdeacon of the said archdeaconry under which it is so set down as aforesaid and shall not belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery or archdeaconry nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or Archdeacon.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said

Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the twenty-seventh section of “The Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway Act 1895,” and of the several Acts (or some of them) relating to the said Commissioners referred to in such section duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the twenty-seventh section of ‘The Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway Act 1895’ and of the several Acts (or some of them) relating to us which are referred to in such section, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme relative to the church and new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham in the town and county of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell.

“Whereas in pursuance of the firstly mentioned Act the Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway Company have purchased and taken the site and fabric of the said church at the price and for the sum of six thousand pounds and have also purchased and taken the glebe belonging to the vicarage of the said new parish at the price and for the sum of four thousand pounds and the said sums have been paid to us as directed by the said Act.

“And whereas a site for a new church situate within the limits of the new parish of Hyson Green in the suburbs of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell aforesaid was by a deed dated the twentieth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven conveyed to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and no consecrated church has yet been erected upon such site.

“And whereas it has been proposed to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the new church of Saint Stephen be provided out of the proceeds of the sale of the present church of Saint Stephen Nottingham should be erected upon the site so conveyed to us as aforesaid and that a separate district comprising within its limits the said site for the proposed new church of Saint Stephen aforesaid should be formed out of the said new parish of Hyson Green.

“And whereas the endowments of the said new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham are now represented by a sum of three thousand seven hundred pounds being the balance of the said sum of four thousand pounds after deducting therefrom a sum of three hundred pounds which has been applied in accordance with the Act in liquidating a mortgage on a part of the glebe aforesaid and by annual grants together amounting to two hundred
