**MARAZION, CORNWALL.**—Forthwith and entirely in the old Church Cemetery, Marazion, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults as are now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves and earthen graves as are now existing, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of this Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

**SPENNYMOOR, DURHAM.**—Forthwith and entirely in the Spennymoor Church in the county of Durham; and also in the churchyard after the thirtieth April one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight except as follows:—

In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of this Order as can be buried at or below that depth.
