#### PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners VV for England have, in pursuance of the twenty-seventh section of "The Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway Act 1895," and of the several Acts (or some of them) relating to the said Commissioners referred to in such section duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say :-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the twenty-seventh section of 'The Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway Act 1895' and of the several Acts (or some of them) relating to us which are referred to in such section, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme relative to the church and new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham in the town and county of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell.

"Whereas in pursuance of the firstly mentioned Act the Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway Company have purchased and taken the site and fabric of the said church at the price and for the sum of six thousand pounds and have also purchased and taken the glebe belonging to the vicarage of the said new parish at the price and for the sum of four thousand pounds and the said sums have been paid to us as directed by the same

"And whereas a site for a new church situate within the limits of the new parish of Hyson Green in the suburbs of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell aforesaid was by a deed dated the twentieth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven conveyed to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and no consecrated church has yet been erected upon such site.

"And whereas it has been proposed to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the new church of Saint Stephen to be provided out of the proceeds of the sale of the present church of Saint Stephen

conveyed to us as aforesaid and that a separate district comprising within its limits the said sice for the proposed new church of Saint Stephen aforesaid should be formed out of the said new parish of Hyson Green.

"And whereas the endowments of the said new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham are now represented by a sum of three thousand seven hundred pounds being the balance of the said sum of four thousand pounds after deducting therefrom a sum of three hundred pounds which has been applied in accordance with the Act in liquidating a mortgage on a part of the glebe aforesaid and by annual grants together amounting to two hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence payable by us out of our common fund.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend George Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and caused his episcopal scal to be attached thereto) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the following arrangements shall be made firstly there shall be set apart towards the cost of building a church upon the site which is situate within the limits of the said new parish of Hyson Green and which has been conveyed to us as aforesaid such a portion of the above mentioned sum of six thousand pounds as will in our opinion be sufficient for the purpose.

"Secondly, that as from the day aforesaid all that part of the said new parish of Hyson Green which is described in the Schedule to this scheme and which is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint

Stephen Nottingham.

"Thirdly that the whole right of patronage of the said district, and when the same, district shall have become a new parish then of the said new parish shall subject to the provisions contained in the sixth sub-section of the said twenty-seventh section of the firstly mentioned Act vest in and be fully and freely and at all times exercised by the present patrons of the vicarage of the new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham aforesaid.

"Fourthly that as from the day aforesaid there shall be transferred to the said proposed Nottingham should be erected upon the site so district and new parish the whole of the endowham so represented as aforesaid excepting as is

hereinafter mentioned.

"Fifthly that the furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint Stephen Nottingham shall be removed stored and dealt with under the superintendence and supervision of the Venerable John Gray Richardson Archdeacon of Nottingham the Reverend Charles Douglas Gordon the vicar of the new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham aforesaid and the churchwardens of the said church of Saint Stephen Nottingham.

"Sixthly that as from the date of the consecration of the new church of Saint Stephen Nottingham aforesaid the whole of the territory now comprised within the said new parish of Saint Stephen Nottingham shall be annexed to and shall become and be for all ecclesiastical purposes a part of the contiguous new parish of Saint Mark Nottingham in the said town and county of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell aforesaid.

"Seventhly and lastly that as from the lastlymentioned date a sum of eight hundred and thirtythree pounds six shillings and eightpence being part of the sum of three thousand and seven hundred pounds remaining as aforesaid out of the said sum of four thousand pounds shall be set apart and held by us as an addition to the endowments of the said new parish of Saint Mark Nottingham.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us: from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in · accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing... Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Stephen Nottingham

"All that part of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry district) of Hyson Green in the town and county of the town of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell which is bounded upon the north partly by the district or new parish of New Basford and partly by the parish of Basford both in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the north-west by the said parish of Basford upon the west and upon the south-west by the parish of Radford in the said county and diocese and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the southeast and upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Radford from the new parish of Hyson Green aforesaid at the junction of Alfretonroad with the road called or known as Gregory Boulevard and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Birkin-avenue and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with · Selhurst-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Radford-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named-road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Archer-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eleven chains of thereabouts to its junction with Noelstreet and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance dof sixteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Hyson Green I

> And whereas drafts of the said scheme have been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbent of the said new parish of Hyson Green out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted, shall be taken, and such patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

> And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forth-

No. 1090 .- WITH reference to G. G. O. No. 773 of 1897 the Right Honourable the Viceroy and Governor-General in Council directs the publication of the subjoined letter from the Adjutant-General in India, submitting, under the orders of the Commander-in-Chief, a despatch from Lieutenant-Colonel W. du G. Gray, 1st Punjab Infantry, lately Commanding the Troops in the Tochi Valley, bringing to notice the gallant conduct of Lieutenant H. S. de Brett, Royal Artillery, at Maizar on the 10th June, 1897.

463-F., Field Operations-Tochi, dated Simla, the 4th September, 1897, from Major-General G. de C. Morton, C.B., Adjutant-General in India, to the Secretary to the Government of India, Military Department.

IN continuation of this Department No. 181-T., dated the 8th July, 1897, I have the honour, by direction of the Commander-in-Chief, forward the accompanying letter \* from Lieutenant-Colonel W. du G. Gray, 1st Punjab Infantry, lately commanding Tochi Valley Troops, bringing to notice the gallant conduct of Lieutenant H. S. de Brett, Royal Artillery, at Maizar, on the 10th June, 1897.

2: The Commander-in-Chief recommends that this letter be published as an addition to Lieutenant-Colonel Gray's former despatch which appears in G. G. O. No. 773 of 1897. His Excellency has much pleasure in expressing his appreciation of this gallant act which, performed as it was at the risk of Lieutenant de Brett's life, enabled a gun to be brought into action and thus assisted the escort most materially in its retire-

IN paragraph 10 of my first report\* on the affair of 10th June at Maizar, the rapid manner in which the reinforcements, under Lieutenant H. S. de Brett, Royal Artillery, came up was brought to notice, and also the fact that the enemy was finally beaten off with the new ammunition then received.

2. In addition to the very important service thus rendered, I have now ascertained that Lieutenant de Brett behaved with great personal

gallantry at the time.

When he met the force, then closely pressed by the enemy, he found only one serviceable gun, but no sponges. This gun he served himself, ramming the charges home with a sepoy's rifle, without sponging out between the rounds; and he would not allow this most dangerous work to be done by any one else until a sponge had been improvised by wrapping a puggree round a lance.

- 3. The value of the fire thus maintained in finally dispersing the enemy was remarked in the above-quoted report, but the very gallant part that Lieutenant de Brett took in the service of the gun having only just come to light, I feel that it would be an injustice not to lay more stress on the importance of the part he took generally in the work of the afternoon, and I would ask that the General Officer Commanding may now bring his energy and gallantry to the notice of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief.
- 4. It is necessary to explain that Lieutenant de Brett was unable to bring out with the reinforcements the two guns which had remained in camp at Patta Khel as all the gun and carriage saddles were with the Maizar party; it being Captain Browne's wish to make all his gun mules, some of which were young and new, take an easy share in carrying the guns.

IN forwarding this correspondence I would support the application that the same may be added to Lieutenant-Colonel Gray's despatch No. 230, dated 16th June, 1897, and at the same time beg to bring the very plucky action performed by Lieutenant de Brett, No. 6 Bombay Mountain Battery, to the favourable consideration of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief for some special distinction and reward.

The fact of the gun coming into action would seem to have materially assisted in extricating the escort retiring from Maizar from its perilous position and to have caused the dispersion of the attackers, and this would not have occurred but for the plucky course adopted by Lieutenant de Brett in loading the gun at

I HAVE the honour to bring to the notice of the General Officer Commanding 2nd Brigade the following facts, which I trust may be represented to the General Officer Commanding Tochi Field Force for such action as he may think

Lieutenant H. S. de Brett, Royal Artillery, 6th (Bombay) Mountain Battery, went out from Datta Khel with ammunition for rifles and guns and about two companies of infantry to the relief of the troops retiring from Maizar on the 10th June, 1897. Owing to all the gun and carriage saddles being with the Maizar party, he was only able to take out ammunition.

He met the force near Sheranni, but found only one serviceable gun and no sponges, and the enemy were at the time closely pressing our

He proceeded to load the gun, and did so for the first three or four rounds personally. He personally rammed home the charge, using a sepoy's rifle. There was no means of sponging out between rounds.

It is needless for me to explain the imminent danger Lieutenant de Brett stood in while performing this duty, and I consider it an act of gallantry worthy of being brought to notice.

Ultimately the difficulty and danger of not sponging was got over by using a sowar's lance

with a puggree round it.

I should have known nothing of this had I not in the course of conversation cheited the facts now There was no other British officer present, and Lieutenant de Brett himself kept it quiet.

I wired to Mr. Gee, C.S., now on his way home as soon as I learnt the facts, and he states he remembers Lieutenant de Brett ramming home with a rifle at the time above stated, and there are non-commissioned officers and men of the battery who can testify to it also.

Isle of Ely.—An Area comprising the parish of March in the Isle of Ely (21 October, 1897).
