No. 9.—AMENDMENT TO NORTH SEA PILOT, PART III.

Depth in West Swin.

IN North Sea Pilot, Part III, sixth edition, 1897, page 315, paragraph on "South-West Reach"; and page 319, paragraph marked "Caution"; the statement that the depth on the narrow ridge stretching from the Middle to the Foulness Sand is less than 24 feet should be altered to read less than 21 feet.
