### Wes' port-Alterations in Lights and Night. Tidal Signals.

THE Government of New Zealand has given notice that, on 1st January, 1898, the harbour lights and night tidal signals, hitherto shown at Westport, would be replaced by the under-mentioned lights and signals :--

1. The white harbour light, shown from the flagstaff on the western breakwater, without any additional signal, indicates :- Wait.

2. A red light under the white harbour light, indicates :- Bar unsafe.

8. A green light over the white harbour light, indicates :- Bar safe for vessels of 9 feet draught.

4. A green light under the white harbour light, indicates :- Bar safe for vessels of  $11\frac{1}{2}$  feet draught.

5. A white light under the white harbour light, indicates :- Bar safe for vessels of 14 feet draught.

6. Two red lights are shown, as fairway ligh's, from the beacons on the west side of the harbour within the breakwaters; the front beacon is painted white, the rear beacon, white with a red band.

These lights, when in line, bear S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. and they should be kept in line over the bar and between the breakwaters, until the two red lights, shown from beacons on the western breakwater, are in line, bearing N.W. by N., when these last I ghts should be kept in line astern, up the river to the wharves.

7. The white harbour light is always shown ; the red fairway lights are not shown when the bar is unsafe.

8. The signals to take the bar are shown from the flagstaff on the western breakwater; and, during daylight, a semaphore, attached to that flagstaff, is used when necessary for the guidance of vessels entering or leaving the port.
