

Dunlin, Falcon, Fern Owl (Goatsucker or Night-hawk), Flycatchers (Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher), Godwit, Golden Plover, Goldfinch, Grebe, Greenshank, Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Landrail or Corn-crake, Linnet, Mallard, Martins (House Martin, Sand Martin), Merganser, Merlin, Nighthawk, Nightjar, Nightingale, Nuthatch, Oriole, Owls, Oxbird (Purro), Peregrine Falcon, Pipits (Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit), Plovers (Golden Plover), Pochard, Purre, Raven, Redpole Lesser, Redshank, Redstart, Reeve and Ruff, Ring Ouzel, Roller, Sandpipers (Summersnipe), Shearwater, Shell-drake, Shoveller, Shrike (Butcher Bird), Snipe, Stonechat, Stone Curlew, Stonehatch, Summersnipe, Swallow, Swift, Teal, Thickknee (Thick-kneed Bustard), Tits (Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Coal Tit, Longtailed Tit, Marsh Tit), Treecreeper, Turtle Dove, Wagtails (Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail), Warblers (Blackcap, Chiffchaff, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler), Water Rail, Wheatear, Whimbrel, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Whitethroat Lesser, Widgeon, Wild Ducks, Woodcock, Woodlark, Woodpeckers, Wrens (Wren, Fire Crested Wren, Golden Crested Wren), Wryneck.

Provided that the portion of this Order numbered (5) shall not be in force after the 16th February, 1902.

SHORE OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT LOWESTOFT.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1852, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Yarmouth, to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shore or banks at Lowestoft, between the Harbour of Lowestoft and the boundary between the parishes of Kirkley and Pakefield, being within the said port:

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shore or banks between the points above-mentioned.

AN Order of the Local Government Board: General Order: Suspension in part of General Consolidated Order: Workhouse Medical Officer's Fees:—

Gateshead Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Gateshead Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Poor Law Commissioners, by a General Order bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, made certain rules and regulations relating to the administration of relief to the poor

within certain Unions, including the said Gateshead Union; and by Article 182 of the said Order provision was made for the payment of special fees to Medical Officers in certain cases:

And whereas it is expedient to suspend, as here-in-after mentioned, the operation of the said article as regards the Medical Officer for the Workhouse of the said Gateshead Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby suspend the operation, until We by Order shall otherwise direct, of Article 182 of the above-cited Order with respect to the Medical Officer for the time being for the Workhouse of the said Gateshead Union.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 9TH FEBRUARY 1898.)

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA INFECTED PLACE.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—the farm buildings known as Claytye Farm, in the parish of Great Warley, in the county of Essex, in the occupation of Richard Mallinson,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the seventeenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
