PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities &c. of the Parish Council of Hemel Hempsted, and of the Rural District Council of Hemel Hempsted, in the county of Hertford, and for other purposes as settled by a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882:—

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Act named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularized:

And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the parish and town of Hemel Hempsted petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for the Grant of a Charter of Incorporation:

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council:

And whereas it was proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the said Charter, and Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Council, was pleased to approve the grant of a Charter so doing:

And whereas by a Charter granted by King Henry the Eighth in the year 1539, the Bailiff and Inhabitants of the parish and town of Hemel Hempsted were incorporated with certain rights, powers, and privileges set out in the said Charter, and have since continued incorporated under that Charter and divers other Charters granted subsequently in and between the years 1577 and 1693:

And whereas the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by the said Charters have now become for the most part obsolete, or have been superseded by legislation, but certain property and rights in respect of markets and market tolls remain vested in the bailiff for the time being and inhabitants or in the bailiff for the time being of Hemel Hempsted:

And whereas Hemel Hempsted is a rural parish and has a Parish Council and Parish Meeting:

And whereas the Parish Council is the authority for the execution of the Lighting and Watching Act, 1833:

And whereas the parish of Hemel Hempsted forms part of the district of the Hemel Hempsted Rural District Council:

And whereas under section two hundred and two of "The Public Health Act, 1875," the said Rural District Council has delegated to a Parochial Committee consisting partly of members of the said Rural District Council representing the parish of Hemel Hempsted on the said District Council, and partly of members of the Hemel Hempsted Parish Council, all the powers of the said Rural District Council

as sanitary authority within the said parish of Hemel Hempsted, save only such powers as related to sewerage and the disposal of sewage within the said parish:

And whereas the said Rural District Council has appointed a Special Committee to exercise their powers relating to sewerage and the disposal of sewage within the said parish:

And whereas the councillors of the said Rural District are also the guardians of the poor of the Hemel Hempsted Union, and it is expedient that the councillors representing the parish of Hemel Hempsted should for all poor law purposes remain in office and exercise their functions as guardians until the date on which they would have retired if this Scheme had not been made:

And whereas under "The Highway Act, 1835," and the proviso to section twenty-five (1) of "The Local Government Act, 1894," the management of the highways within the parish of Hemel Hempsted is vested in the board for repair of the highways in the said parish elected by the Parish Council of Hemel Hempsted:

And whereas there is a School Board in the parish of Hemel Hempsted, and it is expedient that the said School Board should become the School Board of the Borough:

And whereas the said Parish Council of Hemel Hempsted and the said Rural District Council as sanitary authority and the said board for repair of the highways are local authorities within the meaning of Part XI of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," and it is expedient that all rights, powers, property, and liability vested in or attaching to the said bodies, so far as the same relate to the area of the Municipal Borough created by the said charter, should be transferred to and vest in the Council of the Borough in manner hereinafter provided:

And whereas the said Rural District Council have adopted "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889," and "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890," and it is expedient that the provisions of those Acts should be in force within the borough as if they had been adopted by the Council of the Borough:

And whereas there is an isolation hospital for persons suffering from infectious diseases, which is vested in the said Rural District Council, and it is desired to preserve to all the parishes which have contributed to provide the said hospital the same rights and liabilities in connection therewith as have heretofore existed:

And whereas it is expedient that all property, rights, and liabilities which now remain vested in or attaching to the said ancient borough of Hemel Hempsted, or the bailiff for the time being and inhabitants of the said borough, or the bailiff for the time being, should be transferred to and vest in the new Corporation, and it is expedient that the Mayor of the borough be authorized to use the ancient title of Bailiff as an honorary title in addition and without prejudice to his official title of Mayor:

And whereas it is expedient that the County Council of the administrative county of Hertford should retain in and for the borough of Hemel Hempsted all the powers, duties, and liabilities in relation to the several matters set out in section thirty-nine of "The Local Government Act, 1888," which have heretofore been exercisable or attached to the said County Council:

And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a Scheme should be settled pursuant to Part XI of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," containing the provisions hereinafter contained:

Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows :—

1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Hemel Hempsted Scheme, 1898.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the Charter above referred to, or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever day is the later. This date is herein mentioned as "the commencement of this Scheme."

3. The Parish Council of Hemel Hempsted, the Rural District Council of Hemel Hempsted and all existing local authorities within the civil parish of Hemel Hempsted and their powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities, and privileges shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter, or the creation of the said borough and the said Councils and authorities shall from the date of the grant of the Charter until such commencement be deemed to have continued and continue to enjoy, be subject to, and exercise the said powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities, and privileges, as if no such Charter had been granted, and all their acts from the date of the grant of the said Charter until the commencement of this Scheme, shall be and shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no such Charter had been granted.

4. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Parish Council and Parish Meeting of the parish of Hemel Hempsted shall cease to exist, and any powers and duties transferred by "The Local Government Act, 1894," to such Parish Council or Parish Meeting shall be vested in, exercisable by, and imposed on the persons and authorities in whom they would be vested, or by whom they would be exercisable, or on whom they would be imposed if such parish had been included in an urban district on the appointed day within the meaning of that Act; and all property held for the purpose, or by virtue of such powers and duties, and all debts and liabilities incurred by virtue of such powers and duties shall pass to and vest in the persons and authorities aforesaid. Any property and liabilities of the said Parish Council not held or incurred by virtue of such powers and duties shall be transferred and attached to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Municipal Borough created by the Charter above referred to.

5. The accounts of the Parish Council of Hemel Hempsted and of the Board of Surveyors for repairs of the highways in the parish and of the officers and committees (if any) of such Parish Council and Board of Surveyors respectively shall be made up to the date of the commencement of the Scheme, and shall be audited by the district auditor in like manner and with the like incidences and consequences as if this Scheme had not been made; and the enactments relating to the accounts of Parish Councils and of Boards of Surveyors for repairs of the highways, and to the audit of such accounts and to all matters incidental thereto and consequential thereon, and the Rules made by the Local Government Board thereunder shall apply to such audits, and for the purposes of such audits the Parish Council and Board of Surveyors respectively shall be deemed to exist, and their officers (if any) to remain in office as if this Scheme had not been made.

Provided that any such audit may be held as soon as practicable after this Scheme comes into operation, and that any sum certified by the district

auditor at any such audit to be due from any person shall be paid by such person to the treasurer of the said Municipal Borough.

6. The municipal borough created by the Charter above referred to shall be and is hereby placed immediately on, from, and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough aforesaid within the jurisdiction of the Council of the said municipal borough, as the sanitary authority, and shall thenceforth no longer be within the jurisdiction, authority, or district of the Rural District Council of Hemel Hempsted or of the Board of Surveyors elected by the Parish Council of Hemel Hempsted, and all such powers as were exercisable by the said Rural District Council of Hemel Hempsted within the area of the said borough under the provisions of "The Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889," and "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890," shall be transferred to and exercisable by the Council of the said municipal borough as if the said Acts had been adopted by the said Council, and the said Acts shall be deemed to have been adopted by the Council accordingly.

7. All sewers, drains, cesspools, culverts, wells, pipes, pumps, mains, or other sanitary works situate within the area abstracted from the Hemel Hempsted Rural District, and being the property of the Council of that district, and used by them solely for the purpose of the drainage, water supply, or cleansing of the said area, and all liabilities attaching to the said Council as such solely in respect of the said area, and such proportion of the liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Council as such, as well in respect of the said area as the rest of its district, as is hereinafter mentioned, shall immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough acting by the Council as the sanitary authority of the said borough. The proportion aforesaid shall be such part of the said liabilities as bears the same proportion to the whole of the said liabilities as that part of the rateable value of the property within the said area (according to the valuation list in force for poor law purposes immediately before the commencement of this scheme) bears to that part of the rateable value of the property within the whole district of the said Rural District Council (according to the same list).

8. The representatives of the parish of Hemel Hempsted on the said Rural District Council shall cease to act as Rural District Councillors of the Rural District, but they shall continue to act as Members of the Board of Guardians of the Hemel Hempsted Union as though they had been elected as Guardians for the said parish, and they shall remain in office until the date on which they would have retired, if this Scheme had not been made.

9. From and after the commencement of this Scheme, the School Board of the parish shall be the School Board of the borough in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the School Board by the Education Department the borough of Hemel Hempsted had been a Municipal Borough. All property shall vest and all liabilities shall be attached, and everything in connexion with the said Board shall be done, had, and construed accordingly.

10. All the powers, rights, duties, liabilities, obligations, and property which now remain exercisable by attaching to or vested in the said ancient borough, or by to or in the bailiff and the inhabitants thereof, or by to or in the bailiff, shall

immediately, from and after the commencement of this Scheme, pass to and be exercisable by and vest in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough, and it shall be lawful for the said Mayor to use the title of Bailiff as an honorary title in addition but without prejudice to his official title of Mayor. Provided that so much of the property as consists of or is held for the purposes of a market shall be held by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses subject to the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1875."

11. The inhabitants of the borough shall, in respect of the isolation hospital now vested in the Hemel Hempsted District Council for persons suffering from infectious disease, have and enjoy such interests, rights, and benefits, as nearly as may be, as were before the commencement of this Scheme vested in or attaching to the parishioners of Hemel Hempsted, subject nevertheless to the same liabilities as have heretofore existed in connexion therewith in respect of the said parishioners, and subject to such adjustment (if any) of property and liabilities as may be made by agreement or in default thereof fixed by an Arbitrator appointed by the parties or in case of difference as to such appointment nominated by the Local Government Board and the provisions of section 62 of "The Local Government Act, 1888," shall apply *mutatis mutandis* as if the Scheme were a Scheme within the meaning of that Act.

12. The Council of the said Borough shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities under any of the Acts relating to the Police Force or other matters mentioned in section thirty-nine of "The Local Government Act 1888," but all the powers duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by and attached to the County Council of the Administrative County of Hertford and the area of the borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to the County Police Force or other matters mentioned in the said section form part of the county in like manner as if it were not a borough.

13. The Bye-laws and Regulations made by the said Rural District Council with respect to new streets and buildings, nuisances, slaughter-houses, the regulation of lodging-houses, and under the Dairies and Milkshop Order, 1885, and in force at the commencement of this Scheme, shall apply to the borough, but shall, with the exception of the Regulations made under the Dairies and Milkshop Order, 1885, cease to have effect from and after the expiration of one year from the commencement of this Scheme.

14. In case any officer of the Parish Council of Hemel Hempsted, or of any other local authority for whom the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hemel Hempsted, or the Council of the said borough, are respectively substituted, who shall have been employed by the said Parish Council, or by any such local authority, as the case may be, shall not be employed by the Council of the said borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employment of a similar character, and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, such officer shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of or under the control of the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury or any two or more of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position; and the said Lords Commissioners, in awarding the said compensa-

tion, shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of "The Superannuation Act, 1859," to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office: Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary: Provided, nevertheless, that if any such officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within two years of the first meeting of the Council, he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council: Provided also that the term "officer" shall include any person employed by the Parish Council or District Council or by any local authority whose salary or emolument was, or were, payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons: Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right, title, or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever, and as to the amount thereof; and shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause; and, further, every determination of the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them upon any such right, title, claim, amount, or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive; and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable.

Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.

15. Nothing contained in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect the constitution, rights, powers, or liabilities of any Burial Board having jurisdiction within the area of the said borough.

16. Nothing contained in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect the title of the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in right of the Crown to any land or hereditaments, or to any rights of whatsoever description; neither shall anything in this Scheme contained extend or take away, prejudice, diminish, or alter any of the estates, rights, privileges, powers, or authorities vested in or enjoyed or exercisable by the Queen's Majesty, Her heirs or successors.

The Wild Birds Protection (City of Liverpool) Order, 1898.

Application of Bye-laws.

3. These Bye-laws shall be applicable to the Thames as defined by the Thames Conservancy Act 1894 and to all places over which the Conservators have jurisdiction to make Bye-laws under the provisions of the said Act except where the same or any of them are expressly limited to any particular part or parts of the river or place.

Master of Steam Vessel to be on Paddle-Box or Bridge.

14. The master of every steam vessel navigating the river shall be on one of the paddle-boxes or on the bridge of such steam vessel and shall

keep or cause to be kept a proper look-out during the whole of the time it is under way and shall remove or cause to be removed any person other than the crew who shall be on the paddle boxes or bridge of such steam vessel.

Above Teddington Lock this Bye-law shall apply only to steam vessels used for the carriage of passengers or for purposes of excursions which are not steered from the bows or bridge.

Lighters and Sailing Barges to have fifteen inches Freeboard.

16. No lighter or sailing barge shall be navigated on the river below Battersea Bridge without having a freeboard of at least fifteen inches such freeboard to be measured amidships and coamings (if any) may be included in such measurement but in no case must the top of the deck or gunwale be less than three inches above the water's edge when such craft is decked and hatched or less than six inches above the water's edge when such craft is open.

Vessels to be Navigated Singly except when Towed.

22. All vessels navigating the river shall be navigated singly and separately except small boats fastened together or towed alongside or astern of other vessels and except vessels towed by steam.

Not more than Six to be Towed at one time below Albert Bridge, Chelsea.

23. Vessels towed by steam navigating the river below the Albert Bridge at Chelsea shall if more than two in number be placed two abreast (except vessels trading on any canal and not exceeding fourteen feet nine inches in width which may be placed three abreast) and not more than six of any such vessels shall be towed together at the same time and no tow of vessels shall exceed in length the following limits namely:—

Above London Bridge 400 feet;

Between London Bridge and the landing place at the end of Trinity-street Charlton 320 feet;

Below the said landing place 400 feet;

to be calculated from the stern of the vessel towing to the stern of the aftermost vessel towed.

Not more than six to be towed at one time between Albert Bridge and Kingston Bridge.

24. Vessels towed by steam navigating the river between the Albert Bridge at Chelsea and Kingston Bridge may if more than two in number be placed two abreast (except vessels trading on any canal and not exceeding fourteen feet nine inches in width which may be placed three abreast) or may be placed in a single line but not more than six of any such vessels shall be towed together at the same time and the distance between any two of the vessels so towed shall not exceed fifty feet.

Above Kingston Bridge four only to be towed in a single line.

25. Vessels towed by steam navigating the river above Kingston Bridge shall be placed in a single line and not more than four such vessels shall be towed together at the same time and the distance between any two of the vessels so towed shall not exceed forty feet.

Lighters above fifty tons burden to have two and above one hundred and fifty tons burden three persons to navigate them.

27. Any lighter navigating the river shall when under way have at least one competent man constantly on board for the navigation and management thereof and all such craft exceeding fifty tons but of not more than one hundred and fifty tons burden shall when under way have one man in addition and all such craft exceeding one

hundred and fifty tons burden shall when under way have two men in addition on board to assist in the navigation and management of the same with the following exceptions:—When being towed by a steam vessel or when being moved to and fro between any vessels or places a distance not exceeding two hundred yards.

The word "burden" in this Bye-law shall have the same meaning as the expression "burden tonnage" defined by the Thames Watermen's and Lightermen's Act 1893.

LIGHTS REQUIRED BETWEEN YANTLET CREEK AND TEDDINGTON LOCK.

Steamers' Lights.

28. ((a) Second paragraph.)

Above London Bridge.

Steam vessels navigating above London Bridge only may carry the white light at any convenient height above and in line with the stem.

Sailing Vessels' Lights.

29. A sailing vessel under way and any vessel being towed other than a lighter shall carry the same lights as are prescribed by Bye-law 28 for a steam vessel under way with the exception of the white lights mentioned therein which they shall never carry.

Vessels at anchor or moored.

30. (First paragraph.)

With the exceptions hereinafter named a vessel under one hundred and fifty feet in length when at anchor or moored shall carry forward where it can best be seen but at a height not exceeding twenty feet above the hull a white light (hereinafter called the riding light) in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.

Lights for Lighters below London Bridge.

31. Every person in charge of a lighter when under way and not in tow shall between sunset and sunrise when below London Bridge have a white light always ready and exhibit the same on the approach of any vessel.

Fog and Steam Whistle Signals.

36. (Third paragraph.)

A steam vessel shall be provided with an efficient whistle sounded by steam or some substitute for steam so placed that the sound may not be intercepted by any obstruction and with an efficient fog horn to be sounded by mechanical means and also with an efficient bell. A steam launch shall be provided with a similar whistle or other efficient sound signal to be approved by the Conservators. A sailing vessel of twenty tons gross tonnage or upwards shall be provided with a similar fog horn and bell.

(Last paragraph.)

Sailing vessels of less than twenty tons gross tonnage and lighters shall not be obliged to give the above-mentioned signals but if they do not they shall make some other efficient sound signal at intervals of not more than one minute.

All Steam Vessels to Pass Port Side to Port Side.

46. When two steam vessels or two steam launches proceeding in opposite directions the one up and the other down the river are approaching each other so as to involve risk of collision they shall pass port side to port side.
