Three pupils from the British Orphan Asylum, Slough (of which Her Majesty is Patroness) offered a Bouquet.

A Guard of Honour of 100 Rank and File of the 1st Bucks Rifle Volunteers, with the Band of the Battalion, under the command of Major H. G. Rew, was mounted in the Slough Station Yard.

An advanced Escort of the Royal Bucks Hussars, under the command of Colonel Lord Chesham, preceded Her Majesty's carriage from Slough Station to Windsor Castle.

The children of the British Orphan Asylum and the school children of the parishes of Beaconsfield, Denham, Farnham Royal, Fulmer, Gerrard's Cross, Hedgerley, High Wycombe, Iver, Taplow, Upton-cum-Chalvey, and Wooburn, were present in stands near the station.

On leaving Slough Station Her Majesty's route was as follows:—Mackenzie Street, Slough, a portion of High Street, Slough; Windsor Road, Eton College, High Street, Eton; Windsor Bridge, Thames Street, Windsor High Street and Park Street, Windsor; through the Long Walk Gates to Windsor Castle.

The Queen was escorted by a Captain's Escort, with a Standard of the Royal Horse Guards (Blue), under the command of Major H. T. Fenwick.
