The Queen's carriage then moved on at a walk, the Volunteers presenting Arms, and the rest of the Boys cheering Her Majesty through College.

At Windsor Bridge The Queen received an Address from The Conservators of the River Thames, which was presented to Her Majesty by the Chairman, Sir Frederick Dixon Dixon-Hartland, Bart., M.P.
