

The Queen's carriage then crossed Windsor Bridge, the Royal Standard was hoisted on the Round Tower, and the bells of the Parish Church and of St. George's Chapel were rung until Her Majesty arrived opposite Castle Hill.

The Marquis of Lorne, K.T., Governor of the Round Tower, Windsor Castle, was in Attendance at Windsor Bridge.

The Windsor Castle Guard, made up to 100 Rank and File, was mounted as a Guard of Honour in front of Henry VIII's Gateway, facing South, under the command of Captain The Hon. E. Pakenham, Coldstream Guards.

A second Guard of Honour of 100 Rank and File of the Berkshire Volunteers was mounted on Castle Hill, facing Henry VIII's Gateway, under the command of Captain H. Manders.

The Queen's carriage was halted at the foot of Castle Hill.

Her Majesty was received with a Royal Salute.

An Address from the inhabitants of the Borough of New Windsor and the neighbourhood was presented to The Queen by the Chairman, Mr. G. H. Long, Mayor of Windsor, and was read by the Honorary Secretary, Mr. P. Lovegrove, Town Clerk.
