Her Majesty, accompanied by Their Royal Highnesses Princess Henry of Battenberg, Princess Henry of Prussia, and Prince and Princess Aribert of Anhalt, and attended by the Ladies and Gentlemen of The Royal Household, drove to the ground, upon which the Force had been formed in line, and was received with the Royal Salute, the Band of the Coldstream Guards playing the National Anthem.

The Queen drove down the line, and severally inspected the representative detachments, which were named to Her Majesty by Field Marshal Lord Roberts, G.C.B., G.C.S.I., G.C.I.E., #.C.

The Detachments then marched past, and, reforming the line, advanced in review order and presented arms.

The Queen was graciously pleased to signify to the Force the great pleasure it gave Her Majesty at seeing so many of Her Colonial Troops, and hoped they might have a safe return to their homes, and wished them all prosperity.

After which an officer and one of the rank and file from each detachment was paraded before The Queen, to whom Her Majesty was graciously pleased to speak.

The Queen then left the parade ground, passing along the front of the line, the band playing "God Save The Queen."

SATURDAY, 3rd JULY.

The Queen gave a Garden Party at Windsor Castle to the Members of the House of Commons with their families, the Officers of the House, and some Members of the Press Gallery.

Her Majesty, accompanied by Her Royal Highness Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, with Her Highness Princess Victoria of Schleswig-Holstein, Their Royal Highnesses Princess Louise, Marchioness of Lorne, Princess Henry of Battenberg, The Duchess of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, Princess Henry of Prussia, Her Grand Ducal Highness Princess Louis of Battenberg, and The Marquis of Lorne, drove to the east laws of the Castle, where the Members of the House of Commons were received by The Queen.
