Father Lynch, Rector of the College, had the honour of being presented to The Queen by Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Arthur Bigge, K.C.B., C.M.G., Private Secretary to Her Majesty.

The Address was read by Mr. Malcolm M'Donald. A copy of the "Beaumont Review" was presented to Her Majesty by Mr. Austin Clifford.

The Queen graciously received a bouquet from Mr. Alwyn Gosslin, and bouquets were also presented by Mr. Edmund Stapleton Bretherton and Mr. Edward Hope Vere.

The National Anthem was sung and three cheers given for The Queen on Her Majesty's arrival and departure.

The Equerries in Waiting were in attendance on horseback.
