THE following General Order, dated 25th February, 1898, publishing a Despatch from Major-General Sir B. Blood, K.C.B., regarding the operations of the Buner Field Force, has been received from the Government of India:-

FIELD OPERATIONS.—BUNER.

No. 217.—THE Right Honourable the Governor-General of India in Council directs the publication of the subjoined communication from the Adjutant-General in India, submitting, under the orders of the Commander-in-Chief in India, a Despatch from Major-General Sir Bindon Blood, K.C.B., describing the operations of the Buner Field Force, recently under his command.

2. His Excellency in Council concurs in the opinion expressed by the Commander-in-Chief regarding the skill with which the operations of the Buner Field Force were conducted by Major-General Blood, and the discipline and good conduct displayed by the troops throughout these short but successful operations.

From Major-General G. de C. Morton, C.B., Adjutant-General in India, to the Secretary to the Government of India, Military Department,-(No. 669-F, dated Fort William, the 14th February 1898).

I HAVE the honour, by direction of the Commander-in-Chief, to submit, for the information of the Government of India, the accompanying Despatch from Major-General Sir B. Blood, K.C.B., describing the operations of the Buner Field Force, recently under his command.

2. The object with which these operations were undertaken was to coerce into submission the tribes of Buner and Chamla, who had failed to comply with the punitive terms imposed upon them by Government for their complicity in the recent disturbances in Swat. It will be seen

from the Despatch that this object was effected within twelve days from the commencement of operations, both the Bunerwals and Chamlawals having fully submitted to, and complied with the terms of, Government during that period.

3. The celerity with which this successful result has been attained is undoubtedly due to the skilful dispositions made by the Commander of the Force, and to the enterprise, judgment, and vigour with which the operations were carried out, particularly in the attack and capture of the Tanga Pass.

4. His Excellency now commends to the notice of Government the services of Major-General Sir B. Blood and of the brigadiers and others mentioned in the Despatch.

5. The discipline and conduct of the troops, British and Native, have been all that could be desired, and reflect the greatest credit on all ranks.

From Major-General Sir Bindon Blood, K.C.B., Commanding the Buner Field Force, to the Adjutant-General in India,—(No. 1, dated Ambela Pass, the 19th January, 1898).

I HAVE the honour to submit the following account of the operations lately carried out by the

Buner Field Force under my command.

2. It having been determined that the period of grace given to the Bunerwals, to enable them to comply with the terms offered them by Government, expired on the 6th January, 1898, and that they were to be attacked next day, the force under my command was disposed as under on the evening of the 6th January, namely:-

(a.) At Sanghao, about 21 miles north of Mardan.

The 1st Brigade under Brigadier-General W. H.

Meiklejohn, C.B., C.M.G., consisting of:—
1st Battalion, Royal West Kent Regiment. 2nd Battalion, Highland Light Infantry.

16th Bengal Infantry. 20th Punjab Infantry.

The 2nd Brigade under Brigadier-General P. D. Jeffreys, C.B., consisting of :-

1st Battalion, The Buffs. 21st Punjab Infantry

3rd Bombay Light Infantry (5 Companies).

The Artillery under Colonel W. Aitken, C.B., consisting of :-

The 10th Field Battery.

No. 7 Mountain Battery, Royal Artillery. No. 8 (Bengal) Mountain Battery.

The Sappers and Miners under Lieutenant-Colonel W. Peacocke, C.M.G., Royal Engineers, as under:—

(b.) At Pirsai, close to the pass of that name, about five miles across the hills to the east of Sanghao, under Lieutenant-Colonel H. N. McRae, 31st Punjab Infantry:—

The Guides Infantry. The 31st Punjab Infantry.

A section, 4th Company, Bengal Sappers and Miners.

At Rustam, under Lieutenant-Colonel R. B. Adams, V.C., Queen's Own Corps of Guides, who was also in superior command of the force at Pirsai:—

Two squadrons, Guides Cavalry.

Three squadrons, 10th Bengal Lancers.

(c.) On the line of communications, under Colonel V. A. Schalch, Commandant of the line:

At Katlung, 12 miles north of Mardan—

One Company, 3rd Bombay Light Infantry.

At Mardan-

Two Companies, 3rd Bombay Light Infantry.

3. In accordance with the orders I had received on the subject I made all arrangements for the Sanghao Force to attack the Tanga Pass, whose mouth is one mile north of Sanghao, on the morning of the 7th; for the Pirsai detachment to force the pass of that name early on the same morning; and for the cavalry from Rustam to cross this pass when opened, and to work thence towards the line of the enemy's retreat from the

Tanga Pass.

4. I had recommended that the main attack should be made on the Tanga Pass, because it is tactically the most convenient of the Buner passes for the purpose. The hills connected with it are in plan somewhat like the letter D the straight part being a steep and narrow-topped ridge, about eight or nine hundred yards long, running from north-west to south east, while the curved part is a spur starting in a south-westerly direction from the south-east end of the straight ridge, and terminating, after curving round, under the north-west end thereof, with a remarkable ravine or tangi, which forms the first part of the pass and gives it its name. The space inside the D is a sort of basin which the road traverses after it leaves the ravine before mentioned, ultimately finding its way over the south-east end of the ridge from the corresponding end of the basin. High cliffs stand between the south-east end of the ridge and the upper end of the spur forming the curved part of the D, while the north-west end of the ridge is dominated by a lofty peak from which spurs run down towards Sanghao and Buner, respectively. Beyond this peak the main ridge of the mountains continues to the northwest towards the Morah, Shahkot, and Malakand Passes, the last-named pass being some twentyfive miles off in a straight line.

5. The height of the top of the pass, and generally of the narrow-topped ridge which it traverses, over the site of our camp at Sanghao, is upwards of 1,800 feet, while the climb to the top of the ridge from the basin below it is about 1,400 feet. The spur opposite the pass is perhaps at its highest part a hundred feet or so lower than the top of the pass, and at its lower end, where I placed the mountain artillery on the 7th, it is some three hundred feet lower still. The top of the high peak at the north-west end of

the pass-ridge is about a thousand feet above it, while the cliffs at its south-east end are surmounted by jagged rocks at even a greater elevation.

6. The ground on the Buner side of the pass is most unfavourable to troops retiring from it before a successful attack, as there is practically no cover whatever in the valley below the pass or on the spurs of the hills on either side for a distance from it considerably exceeding outside rifle range. It will be seen further on how this circumstance affected the tactics of the Bunerwals

on the 7th January,

7. When I reconnoited the Tanga Pass on the afternoon of the 6th January, I observed about 1,000 men with thirty standards distributed along the top of the ridge. There were also many sangas on the commanding points, and the men made the usual noisy demonstrations of hostility by shouting, beating tom-toms, and letting off their guns. In the early part of the night a few ineffectual shots were fired into camp, but there being a bright moon the firers were easily driven away with some less.

8. At about 8.30 A.M. on the 7th the artillery under Colonel Aitken, C.B., moved off under cover of the 1st Battalion of the Buffs, five companies of the 3rd Bombay Light Infantry, and a squadron of the 10th Bengal Lancers, the whole under the command of Brigadier-General P. D. Jeffreys, C.B. The 10th Field Battery under Major C. A. Anderson commenced the action at 9 A.M., by opening fire from a knoll close to the mouth of the ravine which forms the entrance to the pass. No. 8 (Bengal) Mountain Battery, under Captain A. H. C. Birch, Royal Artillery, and No. 7 Mountain Battery under Major M. F. Fegan, Royal Artillery, followed suit before 10 A.M., from a shoulder of the spur facing the pass-ridge to the right of the field battery. The 3rd Bombay Light Infantry (five companies) under Lieutenant - Colonel F. G. T. Welch, and the squadron of the 10th Bengal Lancers, under Captain W. Stewart formed the immediate escort of the guns, while the Buffs under Lieutenant-Colonel A. E. Ommanney climbed to the top of the spur on their right, and commenced firing volleys at the enemy on the opposite ridge at ranges of 1,400 to 1,600 yards.

9. Simultaneously with the advance of the artillery, the sappers under Major M. C. Barton, Royal Engineers, proceeded to the mouth of the pass to work on the road, and the 20th Punjab Infantry under Lieutenant-Colonel J. B. Woon commenced climbing the spur which rises half-amile north-west of Sanghao and leads to the high peak at the north-west end of the pass-ridge. Lieutenant-Colonel Woon's orders were to assault this peak when the frontal attack (which I am about to describe) was well advanced, and, if his assault succeeded, to descend on the enemy's right

flank and rear.

10. As soon as the troops concerned in these arrangements were clear, Brigadier - General Meiklejohn, C.B., C.M.G., to whom I had entrusted the duty of carrying out the frontal attack, commenced his march with the force detailed in the margin\* through the ravine in front of the 10th Field Battery. This movement took some time as the road had

been badly broken down by the enemy during ! the night, and while it was going on the artillery and the Buffs and the 3rd Bombay Light Infantry kept up a steady and well-directed fire on the passridge, which prevented the enemy from showing otherwise than by ones and twos, and altogether demoralized them. Ultimately, about noon, Lieutenant-Colonel Woon was approaching his objective, while Brigadier-General Meiklejohn was also ready, I directed the last-named officer to deliver the frontal attack, which was carried out in fine style by the infantry under his com-mand,—the Royal West Kent and 16th Bengal Infaniry, preceded by a detachment of the 4th Company, Bengal Sappers, under Lieutenant D. M. Griffith, Royal Engineers, moving by the pass-road, the 21st Punjab Infantry on their loft up two very difficult spurs, and the Highland Light Infantry up a third spur still further to the left. At about 1.30 P.M. Lieutenant-Colonel Woon had driven the enemy from the north-western peak with the loss of two standards and some fifteen killed, and at about 2 P.M. Brigadier General Meiklejohn's battalions crowned the pass-ridge within a few minutes of each other. Before this, however, the enemy, finding that they could not impede our frontal attack without exposing themselves to a murderous fire from the artillery and infantry on the spur in their front, and that Lieutenant-Colonel Woon was pressing and outflanking their right, did not wait for our men to close with them, but retired precipitately down the valley on Kingargali and the hills beyond it, suffering some loss from the fire directed upon them by the infantry after they had crowned the ridge. Royal West Kent were sent on at once to Kingargali, and were followed so n afterwards by Brigadier-General Meiklejohn with the Highland Light Infantry and the 20th Punjab Infantry. The 21st Punjab Infantry rejoined their own brigade at Sanghao in the afternoon, and the 16th Bengal Infantry remained for the night on the top of the pass, where the 4th Company, Bengal Sappers, under Lieutenant H. R. Stockley, Royal Engineers, and the 5th Company, Queen's Own Sappers, under Captain E. P. Johnson, Royal Engineers, also spent the night after working on the road until dark.

11. The road over the pass turned out, as I expected, quite impracticable for mules; but as I had provided coolie transport in view of this contingency, the troops in advance underwent no unusual hardships in the interval that elapsed before the pass was regularly opened for mule transport, which was done most successfully on the 10th January, after nearly three days' excellent and energetic work by the Royal Engineers and Sappers under the orders of Lieutenant-Colonel W. Peacocke, C.M.G., the Commanding Royal Engineer of the Force.

12. Only one casualty occurred on our side in this action; the causes of this fortunate result being that the accurate fire of our artillery, and of our infantry at long range, made it impossible for the enemy to bring an effective fire to bear on our advancing troops, or even to roll down stones on them to any great extent; and that the unfavourable nature of the ground in the rear of the enemy's position rendered it imperative for them, as soon as it appeared clear that they would have ultimately to retire, to do so in good time, before it was possible for them to try conclusions with the sword.

13. The endurance of our infantry, and the careful and judicious leading of their officers, were conspicuous throughout the day. The signalling arrangements, under Captain E. V. O. I J. M. C. Colvin, Royal Engineers.

Hewett, Royal West Kent Regiment, were perfectly carried out, and were of the greatest value, as they enabled me to time the various movements with an accuracy which would not have been otherwise possible, and which was of course one of the causes of our easy success. I have already alluded to the fire of the artillery, under Colonel W. Aitken, C.B., which left nothing to be desired in regard to accuracy and sound management.

14. The strength of the enemy present was about 2,000 men, and considerable reinforcements were on the way to help them, but retired without taking any part in the action. It is now reported that the long-range volleys fired by the Buffs had a most demoralizing effect, as the bullets arrived before the sound of the discharges, whose smoke also could not be seen; so that the volleys could not be "dodged." The enemy's casualties, as reported up to date, included about 50 killed.

15. While the operations described above were in progress, the force under Lieutenant-Colonel Adams, V.C., at Rustam and Pirsai [see paragraph 2 (b) ante] was not idle. On the 6th January the cavalry\* reconnoitred the Pirsai, Malandri, and Ambela Passes, finding some 40 men on the first named, and 8 0 to 1,000 on each of the others. On the afternoon of the same day the infantry† of the force under Lieutenant-Colonel H. N. McRae marched from Rustam to Pirsai village, where they bivouacked for the night; and at 7.30 next morning advanced against the pass, which they took with slight At 11 A.M., the cavalry commenced opposition. to cross the pass, which was found exceedingly difficult for horses, especially on the north side, where a great deal of ice and hoar frost was met with, ultimately Lieutenant Colonel Adams, V.C., reconneitred in person with infantry towards Bampokha as far as Kuai, and then returned for the night to Chorbanda, below the pass. Nextday, the 8th, he opened communications with Brigadier-General Meiklejohn at Kingargali and reconnoitred to Tursak, and towards the southeast, finding a gathering of the enemy on the hills near Tursak. On the evening of this day Lieutenant-Colonel Adams and the cavalry joined the 1st Brigade under Brigadier-General Meiklejohn at Kingargali, Lieutenant-Colonel McRae also joined General Meiklejohn on the 10th with his infantry and sappers, after three days' very hard work in getting his baggage over the pass.

16. The movement thus successfully carried out by Lieutenant-Colonel Adams, V.C., was of very great value, as the sudden appearance of five squadrons and two battalions in the middle of the Buner country, in addition to the brigade which came over the Tanga Pass, helped most effectually to prevent the enemy from being encouraged to make fresh resistance, as they might have been otherwise in consequence of the delay which necessarily took place before I could bring supplies enough over that pass to enable me to advance.

17. On the 9th January, as I found it hopeless to make the Tanga Pass fit for camels in any reasonable time, and as water was very scarce at Sanghao, I moved Brigadier-General Jeffreys from that place to Katlang with the portion of

his brigade which was at Sanghao, it being equipped with camel transport; and I directed him to proceed by easy marches to the Ambela Pass, where I intended to join him later. The 10th Field Battery accompanied Brigadier-General Jeffreys.

18. The first move in force from Kingargali was made by Brigadier-General Meiklejohn into the Bazargai Valley on the 10th January, with a small column consisting of two battalions, one battery, two squadrons and a detachment of

Sappers.

19. On the 11th I received a report that preparations were being made by the enemy to offer resistance near Tursak to my further advance. had arranged to organize my first brigade under Brigadier-General Meiklejohn as a brigade of all arms\* and to march with it through Buner to Chamla, dealing with the various sections of the tribes during the movements; and on hearing of the intended resistance I made preparations to add a battalion and three squadrons temporarily to this brigade, if necessary; while at the same time I directed Brigadier-General Jeffreys, who was still at Katlang, to march at once on the Ambela Pass, and to make himself felt there as soon as possible.

20. However, the intended opposition fell through, as the Bunerwals came to the conclusion that the risk of defeat, and of the destruction of their property which would have followed it, was too great, and I accordingly sent the extra battalion and three squadrons to join General Jeffreys viå Sanghao and Katlang, as I did not consider it

advisable to take them on with me.

21. On the 12th January I moved the force at Kingargali (except half a battalion left to garrison the post) to Tursak, where Brigadier General Meiklejohn joined me with his column from the Bazargai Valley on the same day. (n the 13th Brigadier-General Meiklejohn marched with a small column of all arms to Bai, near the famous shrine of the Pir Baba, which was visited by the Mahomedan officers and soldiers of the column; and on the 14th he moved to Hilai. On the same day I completed the provisioning of the 1st Brigade up to the 24th January, and, having dropped communication with Sanghao, I marched the troops at Tursak on the 15th to Dagar, sending Brigadier-General Meiklejohn with his column from Hilai to Rega to destroy the house and property of Mulla Saidulla, the Mad Fakir. On the 16th Brigadier-General Meiklejohn moved to Barkilli, close to the Boner Pass, where I joined him, and the force at Dagar marched under Lieutenant-Colonel Adams, V.C., to Bajkatta.

22. I had now reached the south-eastern border of Buner, and all the Bunerwal sections had paid up their fines and made submission as I passed

through or near their several districts.

23. Meanwhile Brigadier-General Jeffreys, on receiving my telegram of the 11th directing him to push on towards the Ambela Pass, marched to Rustam the same day, and thence to Surkabi, at the mouth of the pass, on the following day. Some slight show of opposition was made to him at first, which resulted in the loss to the enemy of three killed and two wounded, but by the evening of the 16th he had fully occupied the pass, while Major E. Blunt, Royal Engineers, under his orders, had opened a road fit for camels down to its foot on the Chamla side. General Jeffreys received 900 mules from Peshawar on the 16th, and in accordance with my instructions prepared to march his brigade into Chamla on the 17th.

24. On the 15th Colonel V. A. Schalch, the Commandant of Communications, evacuted Sanghao, and the line thence to Mardan, and on the following day he had opened the line from Mardan to Surkhabi, forming the advanced depôt at Rustam.

25. On the 17th I moved from Barkilli to Ambela in Chamla with Brigadier-General Meiklejohn's force, leaving Lieutenant-Colonel Adams' force at Bajkatta for one more day, in order that the survey of that neighbourhood might be completed. At Ambela I met Brigadier-General Jeffreys, who occupied Kogah and Nawagai with his brigade, and proceeded to reconnoitre the lower end of the Chamla Valley with the 10th Bengal Lancers, under Major F. A. Blyth.

26. The Chamlawals had paid up all fines by the afternoon of the 18th, and consequently on that and the following day I moved the whole of my force over the Ambela Pass into British territory; so that the Buner expedition was concluded on the twelfth day after its commencement

on the 7th January.

27. The discipline and conduct of the troops throughout the expedition were all that could be desired. The 1st and 2nd Brigades were most ably and efficiently commanded by Brigadier-General W. H. Meiklejohn, C.B, C.M.G., and Brigadier-General P. D. Jeffreys, C.B., respectively; and I have the honour accordingly to recommend these officers strongly to the favourable consideration of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief.

28. It will be understood from the smoothness and rapidity with which the operations of the force were carried out, that the staff duties of all kinds-divisional, brigade, line of communications, and at the base—were performed in a very perfect manner by the officers concerned, each in his own sphere. The names of the principal staff officers who thus contributed so largely to the success of the expedition are as under, and I have the honour to recommend them all to the favourable consideration of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief:-

35. Rai Bahadur Lorinda Mal, Contractor to the Commissariat of the force, is brought to favourable notice by Major H. Wharry, D.S.O., Chief Commissariat Officer, and I accordingly beg to recommend that his services may be rewarded in some suitable manner.

36. I regret that the Nabha Infantry, who were sent to join the Buner Field Force towards the conclusion of the operations, did not arrive in time to take part in them. I inspected the battalion at Mardan on the 20th January, and was well satisfied with the turn-out of all ranks and with the manner in which they moved and in which the men handled their arms.

37. I have the honour to attach a casualty return, together with a sketch of the scene of the action on the 7th January. The Intelligence Department maps may be consulted for other details.

## Privy Council Office, Whitehall, April 21, 1898.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities &c. of the Urban District Council of the Town of Hove in the Administrative County of East Sussex, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas by "The Municipal Corporations Act 1882" it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the town of Hove in the administrative county of East Sussex on the seventeenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six presented a petition to Her Majesty the Queen praying for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said Petition was referred to the Committee of Council and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Urban District of the Town of Hove (which is formed by and is coterminous with the parishes of Hove and Aldrington) a Municipal Borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof and by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be so created. And Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Council was pleased to approve the grant of a Charter in accordance with such Petition.

And whereas by "The Hove Commissioners Act 1873" the parish of Hove was formed into a district for sanitary local government improvement and police purposes under a Board of Commissioners incorporated under the name of "the Hove Commissioners" and the said Commissioners were constituted the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said district under "The Public Health Act 1872" and were empowered to exercise and execute all the powers authorities and duties conferred and imposed by the Sanitary Acis as defined by the said "Public Health Act 1872" as if the district were a corporate district as defined by "The Public Health Act 1848" and "The Town Police Clauses Act 1847" was incorporated with the said Act and certain special powers were given to the said Commissioners for the better government of the said district.

And whereas by "The Hove Commissioners Act 1877" "The Hove Commissioners Act 1873" was amended and certain further powers were conferred on the said Hove Commissioners.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-seventh day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Abingdon &c.) Act 1880" "The Hove Commissioners Act 1873" was further amended.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board dated the sixteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three and confirmed by "The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act 1883" "The Hove Commissioners Act 1877" was amended and further powers were conferred on the said Hove Commissioners.

And whereas by an Order of the Joint Com. mittee of the Councils of the Administrative Counties of East and West Sussex dated the second day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three and confirmed by the Local Government Board on the twenty-sixth day of September one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three it was ordered that the area of the parish of Aldrington being a part of the Rural Sanitary District of the Steyning Union and immediately adjoining the Urban Sanitary District of the town of Hove should be transferred from the said Rural Sanitary District to and should form part of the said Urban Sanitary District which Urban Sanitary District should accordingly extend to and include the area of the parish of Aldrington and it was further ordered that the provisions of the local Acts and Provisional Orders therein mentioned as amended by that Order should so far as the same should be capable of being so applied extend and apply to the said Urban Sanitary District as extended by that And it was further ordered that all Bye-Order. laws in force in the town of Hove at the coming into operation of that Order should extend and apply to the said extended District and take the place of all Bye-laws then in force in the said parish of Aldrington: And it was further ordered that section three of "The Hove Commissioners Act 1873" should be read and have effect as if the words "shall mean the parishes of Hove and Aldrington" were therein inserted instead of the words "shall mean the parish of Hove."

And whereas by an Order of the East Sussex County Council dated the thirteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfive and confirmed by the Local Government Board on the sixth day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six the boundary between the parishes of Portslade and Aldrington between the points mentioned in such Order was defined.

And whereas by an Order of the East Sussex County Council dated the seventeenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and ninetysix and finally approved on the twelfth day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six the boundaries of the wards of the said Urban District of Hove were altered and defined as therein mentioned such alteration to take effect as from the first day of January one thousand eight

hundred and ninety-seven.

And whereas by an Order of the Board of Trade made under the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 and 1888 and confirmed by "The Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation Act 1890" powers were given to the Hove Commissioners for the supply of electricity for lighting and other purposes within the town and district of Hove as constituted at the commencement of that Order. And by deed dated the eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two the said Commissioners in accordance with the provisions of "The Electric Lighting Act 1882" and of the said Order and with the consent of the Board of Trade contracted with the Hove Electric Lighting Company for the execution and main-'tenance of the works necessary for the supply of electricity within the said area and transferred to such Company the powers of the said Commissioners under the said Order for the term of forty-two years from the eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two. Subject to an option to the said Commissioners to purchase as therein mentioned the Undertaking buildings works machinery and plant of the said Company at the expiration of twenty-one years and at the expiration of every seven years there-

And whereas by "The Hove Commissioners Act 1873" the said Hove Commissioners were constituted the Burial Board for the execution of the Burial Acts and it was enacted that all expenses incurred by the said Commissioners in carrying the said Acts into execution should be chargeable upon and paid out of the general district rate and all sums which might be received by the said Commissioners under the said Acts should be carried to the credit of the District Fund account and the powers duties and obligations of the said Commissioners as the Burial Board were amended by the above recited Provisional Order of the twenty-seventh day of April one thousand eight huncred and eighty. And by the above recited Order dated the second day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three which transferred the parish of Aldrington to the Urban Sanitary District of the town of Hove it was ordered that the powers duties and obligations of the said Commissioners as the Burial Board should be extended to the said parish of Aldrington.

And whereas under an Order of the Local Government Board dated the twenty-fourth day of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety-

respectively the twenty-sixth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four and the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five the said Hove Commissioners were entitled to choose out of their own body three persons to be members of the New Shoreham Port Sanitary Authority and it was ordered that threethirteenths of the expenses incurred by the said Port Sanitary Authority should be contributed by the said Commissioners.

And whereas under and by virtue of "The Elementary Education Act 1870" and the Acts amending the same a School Board was formed for the school district of the parish of Hove and subsequently for the united districts of the

parishes of Hove and Aldrington.

And whereas by "The Brighton Intercepting and Outfall Sewers Act 1870" a Board was constituted for making and maintaining the sewers and works by that Act authorized for the intercepting and carrying into the sea the sewage of the parishes of Brighton Hove and Rottingdean such Board to be appointed by the local authorities in the said Act mentioned. And by "The Hove Commissioners Act 1873" it was enacted that the Hove Commissioners should be a local authority within the meaning of "The Brighton Intercepting and Outfall Sewers Act 1870" and all the provisions of that Act should thenceforth be applicable to them the said Commissioners and their district-which was then limited to the parish of Hove.

And whereas by virtue of "The Local Government Act 1894" all the rights powers duties property and liabilities of the said Hove Commissioners were transferred to and are now vested in the Urban District Council of the town of Hove

And whereas the said Urban District Council of the town of Hove and the said School Board are local authorities within the meaning of Part XI of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1882" as amended by "The School Boards Act 1885."

And whereas this Scheme was before being settled by the Committee of Council referred for consideration to Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department to the Local Government Board and to the Committee of the Lords of the Privy Council on Education (hereinafter referred to as the Education Department).

And whereas it is expedient that a scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now therefore pursuant to "The Municipal Corporations Act 1882" and every other power enabling them in that behalf the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein and do hereby direct order and declare as follows: -

## Short Title.

This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Hove Scheme 1898."

## Commencement of Scheme.

This Scheme when confirmed by Order in Council shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter and this Scheme shall be construed and apply as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this two as amended by two subsequent Orders dated | Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

Sanitary Authority.

The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall from and after the commencement of this Scheme and thenceforth be placed within the jurisdiction of the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Hove acting by the Council of the borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

Urban District Council Abolished.

The Urban District Council of the town of Hove and their powers duties rights obligations and privileges shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said borough and the said Urban District Council shall from the date of the grant of the Charter until such commencement be deemed to have continued and continue to enjoy be subject to and exercise the said powers duties rights obligations liabilities and privileges as if no such Charter had been granted and all their acts from the date of the grant of the said Charter until the commencement of this Scheme shall be and shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no such Charter had been granted. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Urban District Council shall be abolished and cease to exist and the existing division into wards of their district shall also be abolished and cease to exist.

## Transfer of Junisdiction Property &c. of Urban District Council.

All the jurisdiction rights powers duties and property vested in or possessed by the Urban District Ccuncil in any capacity under any Act of Parliament or Order of a Government Department or otherwise or by any person or body in trust for them or any of their members as such or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the said Urban District Council or any of their members as such (and not otherwise expressly transferred by or dealt with by this Scheme) shall be exercisable by and attached to and vested in the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Hove (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") for the Municipal and other Public purposes of the said borough.

All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the said Urban District Council in any capacity or against any property of the said Council shall attach to and be enforce-

able against the Corporation.

Any investigation legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any debt liability penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Urban District Council in any capacity before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued prosecuted or enforced by or against the

Corporation.

The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal and all things in action and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll and all franchises privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value and all Charters records deeds books and documents and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise and includes any estate or interest legal or equitable in or in respect of any property so defined.

The District Fund and the General District Rate of the borough of Hove shall (subject to the provisions of this Scheme respecting the expenses and liabilities of the Burial Board and

to the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882" with respect to the Borough Fund and Borough Rate and the Watch Rate respectively) take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the Urban District and all sums of money payable to from or out of and all liabilities charged on or attaching to the District Fund or General District Rate of the Urban District shall (subject as aforesaid) be paid to from or out of and shall be charged on the District Fund and General District Rate leviable in the said borough.

With respect to the above recited local Acts and the above recited Orders of the Local Government Board and Board of Trade and with respect to any acts matters and things to be done thereunder the

following provisions shall take effect :-

The Corporation acting by the Council shall be substituted for the Urban District Council and all the rights property powers authorities privileges duties and liabilities vested in devolving upon or exercisable by the said Urban District Council and not otherwise dealt with under this Scheme shall be transferred to vested in devolve upon and be exercisable by and shall be enforceable against the Corporation.

The Town Clerk of the borough of Hove shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the

Clerk to the Urban District Council.

Provided that-

1. The property vested in or belonging to the Urban District Council in their capacity of police authority but not their powers for the maintenance and government of the police force shall be transferred to the Corporation and the existing police force shall be transferred to and be maintained and governed by the Corporation as if the said force had been formed under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," and the Acts relating to borough constables.

2. The Councillors returned by the respective Wards described in the Charter as the Brunswick Ward Adelaide Ward and Medina Ward respectively shall form Enclosure Committees for such Wards respectively and shall have exercise and perform all the powers and duties conferred and imposed on the Enclosure Committees constituted by Part V of "The Hove Commissioners Act,

1873."

3. Nothing herein contained shall add to detract from or in any way affect the rights and liabilities under "The Brighton Intercepting and Outfall Sewers Act, 1870," of the Urban District Council, or of the Corporation as substituted for the Urban District Council or shall confer upon the Corporation any right to use the sewers by that Act authorized or any of them for the discharge of any sewage or refuse matter from such parts (if any) of the borough of Hove as were not at the commencement of the Scheme entitled to drain into the said sewers or shall confer on such parts (if any) of the borough of Hove any right to use the said sewers.

4. Nothing herein contained shall add to detract from or in any way affect the powers of the Brighton Intercepting and Outfall Sewers Board.

Subject as aforesaid and to the other provisions of this Scheme the provisions of the said Acts and Orders which are in force at the commencement of this Scheme shall continue in full force and effect.

Bye-Lows.

All bye-laws regulations and tables of fees or charges made or appointed by the Urban District Council (whether under a general or local Act or Order) and in force at the commencement of this

Scheme shall until the same are repealed or varied by the Corporation continue in force and be enforceable within the borough with the substitution only of the Corporation and their officers for the Urban District Council and their officers respectively.

Burial Board.

The Council of the borough of Hove shall be substituted for the Urban District Council of the town of Hove as the Burial Board and all the rights property powers authorities duties and liabilities vested in devolving upon or exercisable by the said Urban District Council as the Burial Board shall be transferred to vested in devolve upon and be exercisable by and be enforceable against the Council of the said borough.

The officers and servants of the Urban District Council as the Burial Board shall become the officers and servants of the Council of the borough acting as the Burial Board of the borough.

All expenses and liabilities incurred by the Urban District Council or by the Hove Commissioners in the capacity of such Council or Commissioners respectively as the Burial Board and which are outstanding at the commencement of this Scheme and all expenses and liabilities incurred by the Council of the borough in their capacity of Burial Board shall be paid and satisfied out of and shall be charged upon and attach to the borough rate. All fees and sums receivable by the Council in their capacity of Burial Board shall be carried to the credit of the borough fund.

All regulations as to fees charges and payments made by the Urban District Council in their capacity of Burial Board and in force at the commencement of this Scheme shall continue in force until the same are repealed or varied by the Council of the borough.

#### School Board.

The Hove and Aldrington (United District) School Board shall be the School Board for the borough of Hove by the name of the Hove Borough School Board in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the Hove and Aldrington (United District) School Board by the Education Department the area within the jurisdiction of the said School Board had been a Municipal Borough. Everything in connection with the said Board shall be done had and construed accordingly.

All liabilities and property attaching to and vested in the Hove and Aldrington (United District) School Board immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be and continue attached to and vested in the Hove Borough School Board and all charges charged on the School Fund or in respect of the liabilities of the Hove and Aldrington (United District) School Board on the Poor Rate of the parishes of Hove and Aldrington respectively immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall respectively be charged on the School Fund of the Hove Borough School Board and on the Borough Rate or Fund of the said borough and not otherwise.

Any Bye-laws made by the Hove and Aldrington (United District) School Board under the Acts relating to Public Elementary education and in force at the commencement of this Scheme shall continue in force and apply to the Hove Borough School District.

Any act done by the Education Department or and further every determination of the Treasury the said Hove and Aldrington (United District) upon any such right title claim amount or question School Board or the Council of the said borough shall be absolutely final and conclusive and every

or any Justice since the grant of the Charter shall be deemed to have been lawfully done if the said Department School Board Council or Justice might have lawfully done the same if no Charter had been granted or the said School Board had been the School Board for the said borough.

Savings for Rates, &c.

Notwithstanding the incorporation of the borough and the provisions of this Scheme all rates assessments compositions charges mortgages contracts leases conveyances deeds documents acts matters and things made entered into or done before the commencement of this Scheme by to or with reference to the Urban District Council or the Hove Commissioners shall be as good valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made entered into or done by to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the Urban District Council or the said Commissioners and all arrears of rates may be recovered and all pending proceedings may be continued and completed in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation had been party or privy to the same and been named or referred to therein instead of the Urban District Council or the said Commissioners as the case may be.

Compensation for Existing Officers.

In case any officer of the Urban District Council or of any of the public bodies for whom the Corporation or the Council of the Borough of Hove are respectively substituted who shall have been employed by the said Urban District Council or by any of the said public bodies as the case may be shall not be employed by the Council of the said Borough nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him such officer shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation as the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said municipal borough such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Treasury to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position and the Treasury in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of the Superannuation Acts 1834 to 1892 to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office. Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Acts stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made. Provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them (otherwise than for mis-conduct) within two years of the first meeting of the Council he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council. Provided that the term "Officer" shall include any person employed by the Urban District Council whose salary or emolument is payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other person. Provided also that the Treasury shall be the sole judges as to the right title or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever and as to the amount thereof and the Treasury shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause and further every determination of the Treasury upon any such right title claim amount or question

such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the Treasury consider just and reasonable.

Audit of Accounts of Urban District Council.

The accounts of the Urban District Council and their officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner and with and subject to the like powers duties provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted and the provisions of sections two hundred and forty-seven and two hundred and fifty of "The Public Health Act 1875" as amended by "The District Auditors Act 1879" and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Urban District Councils and their officers shall apply to such audit and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the Urban District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time extent character and operation to the purposes of such audit. Any money certified by the District Auditor at any such audit to be due from any person shall be paid by such person to the Borough Treasurer.
