NOTTINGHAM SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1898.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Movement of Swine out of Borough of Nottingham Prohibited.

1. Unless and until the Board of Agriculture otherwise order, it shall not be lawful to move any swine, fat or store, alive out of the Borough of

Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through the Borough of Nottingham by railway from a place outside that Borough to another place outside that Borough without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or re-booked within that Borough.

Offences.

2. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement,

and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the NOTTINGHAM SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1898.
