No. 553.—THE following alterations are made in G. G. O. No. 178, dated the 18th February, 1898, publishing amendments to Major-General Sir Bindon Blood's despatch, No. 5, of the 27th October, 1897, which detailed the operations of the Malakand Field Force from the 6th September to 27th October, 1897, published in G. G. O. No. 1317, dated 3rd December, 1897:—
