of Appeal; and such copy shall be used and received at the hearing of the appeal. If such notes are not produced the Court of Appeal shall have power to hear and determine the appeal upon any other evidence or statement of what occurred before the judge of the county court which the Court of Appeal may deem sufficient.

- (c.) Order LIX Rules 14 and 16 shall apply to any such appeal, with the substitution of the Court of Appeal for the High Court.
- (d.) Subject to the foregoing provisions, the rules for the time being in force with respect to appeals from the High Court to the Court of Appeal shall, so far as practicable, apply to and govern appeals under the said Act to the Court of Appeal.

5. These Rules may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court, July, 1898, or separately according to their respective headings, with reference to the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1883; and they shall come into operation on the 24th day of October 1898.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF ACRICULTURE. (DATED 4TH JULY 1898.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The sale or exposure for sale of any cattle sheep or swine in or at any market or fair held in the Market Place or on any highway or thoroughfare in the municipal borough of Ripon is hereby prohibited.

2. If a head of cattle or a sheep or a pig is sold or exposed for sale in or at any such market or fair in contravention of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier thereof, and the owner or consignee of each head of cattle and of each sheep or pig so sold or exposed, and the person so selling or exposing the same, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting a sale of cattle sheep or swine at such market or fair, and the purchaser thereat of any cattle sheep or swine so sold or exposed in contravention of this Order such purchaser knowing the animal to be sold or exposed for sale in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
