been received from Captain W. U. Moore, Her Majesty's ship "Research," that the shoal water northward of Auskerry has been found to extend further north than was formerly supposed. A reef of rocks covered with kelp, with 6 to 15 feet over it, extends from the north point of the island in a north-easterly direction for a distance of nearly half a mile.

From the shallowest spot, which is near the north-east end of the reef, the north point of Auskerry bears S. 62° W. distant $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables, and the east point of that island S. 5° W., or approximately in lat. 59° 2′ 40″ N., long. 2° 38′ 50″ W.

This reef often, breaks, and the kelp shows on

the surface at low water ordinary springs.
