Civil Service Commission, August 16, 1898.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

**SPECIAL REGULATIONS** (supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent Notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Clerk in the Operative Department of the Royal Mint.

*These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.*

I. The limits of age for this situation are 20 and 25, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the competitive part of the Examination.

II. Candidates will be required to show what technical education and practical training they have undergone to qualify them for the duty of taking charge of machinery in an engineering establishment and superintending workmen. Evidence on these points must be sent in at such

times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint. If such evidence should prove *primâ facie* satisfactory, the Candidate will be admitted to examination, subject, in the case of his being successful in the competition, to such further inquiry, and the production of such further evidence, as may be necessary.

III. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. Handwriting and Orthography.
2. Arithmetic.
3. Machine Drawing and Construction.
4. Applied Mechanics and Mechanism (including a practical knowledge of engineering work).
5. Applied Electricity.

All Candidates must qualify in subjects numbered 1 and 2, and in two of the remaining subjects. No Candidate may take up more than two of the subjects numbered 3, 4, and 5.

IV. A fee of £1 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

V. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.
