Government Notice.

THE Honourable the Deputy Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has, in virtue of the powers vested in him by Ordinance XVI of 1893, been pleased to modify Government Notice 37 of the 7th February, 1898, and to

direct that all persons arriving at this Port from Bombay, Kurrachee, Egypt, Beyrouth, the Province of Tripoli, and the Province of Benghasi shall, before landing, give to the Boarding Officer the address of the place where they intend to reside, and should they, before the expiration of 15 days from their arrival, change their place of residence, they shall give due notice to the Superintendent of Police, and give the address of their new residence.

During the period of fifteen days from their arrival, all persons referred to in the preceding paragraph of this notice shall be subject to be visited by the District Medical Officer every day between 10 and 11 A.M. at the Government Dispensary of the district in which such persons reside.

Arrête :

ART. 1er. Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1er à 4 de l'arrêté royal du 5 Avril 1897, susvisé, sont rendus applicables aux provenances de la province du Bengale, de la partie de l'empire chinois, située au sud du 30e degré de latitude et de l'île de Formose.

ART. 2. ORDER of the Local Government Board: Appointment of Stocktaker: Amending Order:—
West Derby Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the West Derby Union;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said West Derby Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas by Orders issued by Us, the Local Government Board, and dated respectively the 8th day of March, 1884, the 6th day of August, 1884, and the 6th day of April, 1889, similar requirements are made with respect to certain Accounts prescribed by those Orders to be kept by the Out-Relief Distributors appointed by the said Guardians, and for the Infirmary and the Cottage Homes belonging to the said Union;

And whereas by an Order dated the 29th day of February, 1896, We empowered the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons, termed the Stocktaker, to examine the Stores at the Workhouse, Infirmary, and Cottage Homes of the Union, and to perform the other duties therein after set forth;

And whereas it is expedient that the last-mentioned Order should be amended, and that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that the said Order dated the twenty-ninth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, shall be altered as follows:—

(1.) The following shall be substituted for the third paragraph of Article V:—

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other

time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of drugs, medicines, medical and surgical appliances, and medical stores in the dispensaries at the workhouses and infirmary, and at the out-door dispensaries provided for the said Union, and shall compare the same with the account kept by the dispenser for such dispensaries, showing the receipt and consumption or disposal of the stock committed to his charge.

He shall also on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of provisions and stores in the charge of each of the Out-Door Relief (in kind) Distributors, and shall compare the same with the Accounts required to be kept by those officers respectively.

(2.) The following shall be substituted for Articles VII, VIII, and IX:—

ARTICLE VII.—The Masters and Dispensers of the Workhouses, the Steward and the Dispenser of the Infirmary, the Dispensers of the Out-Door Dispensaries, the Out-Door Relief (in kind) Distributors, and the Superintendent of the Cottage Homes shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article V, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—The Masters and Dispensers of the Workhouses, the Steward and the Dispenser of the Infirmary, the Dispensers of the Out-Door Dispensaries, the Out-Door Relief (in kind) Distributors, and the Superintendent of the Cottage Homes shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IX.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committees to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the above-cited Orders dated the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.
