

yard, shed, or other place where the sheep are to be detained] and I hereby require you to take notice that, in consequence of this Notice and the provisions of the Order of the Board of Agriculture under which this Notice is issued, it is not lawful for any person, until this Notice is withdrawn,—

- (a.) to move from or out of such place as aforesaid any sheep to which this Notice applies; or
- (b.) to move from or out of such place as aforesaid any other sheep that may be thereon or therein; or
- (c.) to move any other sheep into such place as aforesaid; or
- (d.) to permit any other sheep to come in contact with any sheep to which this Notice applies; or
- (e.) to remove from or out of such place any carcass of a sheep, or any skin, fleece, or wool, separate from the carcass of a sheep, or any dung, fodder, litter, or other thing that has been in contact with sheep to which this Notice applies, without the written permission of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

The Order of the Board of Agriculture under which this Notice is issued, provides that if a

sheep or carcass or thing is moved in contravention of such Order, or of this Notice, the owner of the sheep, carcass, or thing, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, carcass, or thing, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep, carcass, or thing, is moved, are liable under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, to the penalties thereby prescribed.
