THE Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that he has approved of the transfer of the Milton Industrial School near Gravesend to new premises at Farnborough, and that the said premises have been provisionally certified by him as fit to be an Industrial School for the reception of Boys, not exceeding 100 in number, under the provisions of "The Industrial Schools Act, 1866."

The Secretary of State has granted the certificate for twelve months only, on the understanding that the number of children will be reduced unless additional accommodation is then provided, as he would not feel justified in granting a permanent certificate for more than 75 children.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:
