Board of Trade (Fisheries and Harbour Department), London, October 1, 1898.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 21st ultimo, from Her Majesty's Representative at The Hague, transmitting the following translation of a Royal Decree of the 24th August :-

(Staatsblad No. 203.) Decree of the 24th August, 1898, for applying the law of 26th April, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 80), supplemented by the law of 20th July, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 164), enacting extraordinary measures for warding off certain infectious diseases and for preventing the spreading and consequences of the same.

In the name of Her Majesty Wilhelmina, by

the Grace of God Queen of the Netherlands, Princess of Orange, Nassau, &c., &c., &c.

We, Emma, Regent of the Kingdom, Taking into consideration that the application of the law of 26th April, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 80), supplemented by the law of 20th July, 1884 (Staatsblad No. 164), enacting extraordinary measures for warding off certain infectious diseases and for preventing the spreading and consequences of the same, is necessary on account of the appearance of the plague and of other diseases specified in some places in foreign parts;

On the proposal of the Minister of the Interior, of the 5th July, 1898, No. 1075, section Medical Police, and of the Minister of Finance, of 9th July, 1898, No. 58, Import and Excise Duties;

Having regard to the Royal Decree of 4th August, 1897 (Staatsblad No. 185);

Having consulted the Council of State (Advice
