ELEMENTARY EDUCATION ACTS, 1870-1893.

THE Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education have issued an order this day for the compulsory formation of a School Board in the undermentioned Parish:-

BY virtue of an Act passed in the twentysecond year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to "extend the Act of the twenty-fourth year of "King George the Third, chapter twenty-six, for " issuing writs during any recess of the House of " Commons, whether by prorogation or adjourn-"ment;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the "time for proceeding to Election during the " Recess:

I do hereby give notice, that it hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, in the manner required by the said Act, that Richard Martin Dane, Esq., one of Her Majesty's Counsel, late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the North Division of the County of Fermanagh, hath accepted the office of County Court Judge and Chairman of Quarter Sessions of the County of Mayo, Ireland, and has been gazetted. thereto in the Dublin Gazette, dated the 4th day of October, 1898, and has thereby vacated his seat, and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said North Division of the County of Fermanagh, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the I ondon Gazette.
