Genova, Sept. 17.

BY a Vessel from *Sardinia* we have Advice, that the Gallies of *Sicily* are cruizing near that Island, and that they have lately taken a French Privateer of 10 Guns and 90 Men. The Spanish Fleet, commanded by the Conde d' Aquilar, was daily expected at *Cagliari* to take in Provisions, in order to keep the Sea for some time longer. The Cardinal Camus and Cardinal Imperiale arrived here the last week from *Rome*; And the first parted from hence again this day for *France*.

Venice, Septemb. 28. Several Vessels are arrived here this week from the *Levant*, by whom we have advice, that the Captain-General *Mocenigo* had raised great Contributions from the Islands in the *Archipelago*; That he had ordered a Squadron of Men of War to cruize at the Entrance into the *Straits* of the *Dardanelli*, and was himself returning with the rest of the Fleet towards *Napoli di Romania*. The last Letters from the *Morea* told us, that the Turks were forming a Camp near *Negrepont*, and that the Venetians had thereupon reinforced their Troops, that guarded the *Isthmus* of *Corinth*, and had cast up some new Works for the greater security of that Pass; And by a Vessel that arrived here this week from *Corfu* we have a report, that the Turks had attempted to pass the said *Isthmus*, but were repulsed with great loss. Signior *Duodo* is made Proveditore Extraordinary of the *Levant*, whither a new Convoy will be sent very speedily with Supplies for the Fleet and Army.

Dantzick, Sept. 17. The Letters from *Poland* tell us, that the King arrived in the

Camp the 24th of the last month with his two Sons Prince *James* and Prince *Alexander*; On the 25th he took a review of the Troops, which were about 24000, and sent a Detachment under the command of the Castellan of *Cutm*, to joyn with 4000 Cossacks, and to make an Excursion towards *Budziack*. On the 6th instant the Army passed the River *Tyras*, and encamped at *Czarnowitz* on the Frontiers of *Moldavia*, with design to continue their march into that Province.

Vienna, Sept. 30. Great quantities of Ammunition are daily sent down the *Danube* towards *Hungary* for the use of the Imperial Army, which passed the *Theysse* near *Zolnock* on the 23d of the last month in their march towards *Great Waradin*. The same day Count *Mansfelt* Prince of *Fundi* arrived in the Camp with a Commission from the Emperor, to be General of the Foot. They write from *Essick*, that several Spies, who had been sent towards *Belgrade*, were come back, and gave an account, that the Turks did not appear near the *Save* in any considerable Body, most of their Troops, which fled from the Battel of *Salinkement*, being retired towards *Adrianople*. We hear from *Croatia*, that the Ban or Governor of that Province was drawing his Troops together in order to some design towards *Bojnia*. Yesterday the News arrived here of the Death of the Elector of *Saxony* *John George III.* who dyed on the 22d of this month at *Tubingen* in the Country of *Wurtemberg* in the 44th Year of his Age, having had by his Marriage with *Anne Sophia*, Daughter of *Frederic III.* King of *Denmark*, *John George IV.* (the present Elector,) who was born the 7th of *October*, 1668: and *Frederic Augustus* born the 12th of *May*, 1670.

From the Camp before Limerick, Octob. 4. On the first instant, in the Evening, the Lords Justices arrived in the Camp; And after some farther Conferences with the Commissioners on the part of the Garrison and their Troops in the County of *C'we*, the Articles for the Surrender of the City of *Limerick*, and the Castles of *Ross* and *Clare*, with all other Castles and Places which are still in the hands of the Irish, were on the 3d finally Concluded and Signed by the Lords Justices, and the General on one side, and the French Governor and Persons deputed by the Garrison on the other; And in pursuance thereof, one of the Gates with a Stone Fort was delivered up to us the same Evening, and this day five of our Regiments marched into the Irish Town; The French, and such of the Irish as have a mind to go beyond Sea, being to continue in the English Town and the Island, till such time as Shipping can be got ready for their Transportation. *Sarsfield* and *Sheldon* design for *France*, but of the Troops they propose to take with them, great numbers have already left them, being too sensible of the ill Usage they have had from the French here in *Ireland*, to Engage again in that Service.

Falmouth, October 8. On Monday last Their Majesties Ship the *Portsmouth* brought in here a small Prize of about 40 Tuns.

Portsmouth, October 11. On the 9th instant Sir *Ralph Delaval* sailed from *St. Helens* with the Squadron under his command to the Westward.

Weymouth, October 13. Sir *Ralph Delaval* came yesterday to an Anchor in *Portland Road*, the Wind being at W. and by N.

Whitehall, October 13. Last night arrived here the *Sieur de Meddaghe*, being sent to Their Majesties by his Father the Baron *de Ginckle*, General of Their Majesties Forces in *Ireland*, with the good News of the Surrender of *Limerick*. And this day about Noon the great Guns were fired from the Tower, and in the Evening Bonfires, Illuminations, and Ringing of Bells, expressed the Publick and General Joy for

this Happy Success of Their Majesties Arms, in the Entire Reduction of that Kingdom under Their Majesties Obedience.
