

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the several County Boroughs for the time being in England and Wales ;—

To the several Urban and Rural District Councils for the time being in England and Wales ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS on the 15th day of June, 1885, Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Privy Council"), in pursuance of the statutory provisions in that behalf, made an Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") which is known as "The Dairies, Cow-sheds, and Milk-shops Order of 1885";

And whereas certain powers of the Privy Council, including the power of altering or revoking the Order, have been transferred to Us, the Local Government Board; and, in pursuance of such powers, the Order has been altered by an Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Amending Order"), which was made by Us on the 1st day of November, 1886, and is known as "The Dairies, Cow-sheds, and Milk-shops Amending Order of 1886";

And whereas it is expedient that the Order as altered by the Amending Order should be further altered:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in Us in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—This Order may be cited as "The Dairies, Cow-sheds, and Milk-shops Order of 1899."

ARTICLE II.—Article 15 of the Order shall be altered so that, for the purposes of the provisions of paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof the expressions in the said Article which refer to disease shall include, in the case of a cow, such disease of the udder as shall be certified by a Veterinary Surgeon to be tubercular; and the Order and the Amending Order shall apply and be construed with the modifications necessary to give effect to this Article.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District (Supplemental):— Gloucestershire Audit District. Parish of Bristol.

To Ernest George Easton, District Auditor:— To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Bristol ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 14th day of April, 1896, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said Ernest George Easton as a District Auditor, and ordered that the District in which he should in future act as Auditor, and which should be

termed "The Gloucestershire Audit District," should, for the performance of the Duties assigned to him by the Order, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, including the Bristol Poor Law Union, and in the Districts named in paragraphs (3) and (4) of Article I of that Order, and in the Districts or areas referred to in paragraph (6) of such Article ;

And whereas by the operation of the Bristol Corporation Act, 1897, the Bristol Poor Law Union above referred to ceased to exist and a new Poor Law Union was formed to consist of the area included in the City of Bristol as extended by the Act ;

And whereas by the Bristol Confirmation Order, 1898, the several Parishes comprised within the Poor Law Union formed by the said Act were united into one Parish called the Parish of Bristol, hereinafter termed the new Bristol Poor Law Union ;

And whereas it is expedient that the duty of auditing the Accounts of the Guardians of the Poor of the new Bristol Poor Law Union and of their Officers should be assigned to the said Ernest George Easton ;

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Ernest George Easton to audit the Accounts of the Guardians of the Poor of the new Bristol Poor Law Union, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in the above-cited Order dated the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six; and that for the purpose of such Audit the new Bristol Poor Law Union shall be deemed to be within the Gloucestershire Audit District; and the said Order shall have effect as if the name of such new Poor Law Union had been originally contained in the Schedule to that Order.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 7TH FEBRUARY 1899.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Conveyance of Animals by Steamship Ulverston.

1. It shall not be lawful during the continuance of this Order for any person to convey or cause to be conveyed any animals to or from any port in Great Britain by the steamship *Ulverston*, registered at the port of London, official number 108231, and now owned by the *Ulverston Steamship Company, Limited*, and such conveyance of animals by that vessel is hereby prohibited accordingly.
