

The Russian List of Lights, 1898, gives the following particulars regarding Tzuip Navolok Point Light, Ribachi Peninsula:—

Tzuip Navolok Light is white occulting every ten seconds, thus:—light seven seconds; eclipse three seconds; elevated 99 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles between the bearings of S. 70° E., through south and west, and N. 10° W.

It is shown from a yellow house, 22 feet high, with red roof and grey lantern, situated about 1½ miles N.W. ½ N. from the south-east extreme of the point.

Approximate position, lat. 69° 45' N., long. 38° 6' E.

No. 67.—GULF OF BOTHNIA— SWEDISH SHORE.

East Bank—Alteration in Buoys.

THE Swedish Government has given notice, dated 25th January, 1899, that the following alterations will be made in the marking of the East Bank (Östra Finngrundet), Gulf of Bothnia:—

a. The red spar buoy, surmounted by a ball and broom, south-eastward of the East Bank, will be replaced by a black spar buoy with white band, surmounted by a black ball.

Approximate position, lat. 60° 59' 30" N., long. 18° 28' 45" E.

b. The black spar buoy to the northward of East Bank will be surmounted by two black balls instead of one.

Strone Point—Gas Buoy Established.

THE Clyde Lighthouse Trustees have given notice, that on and after 26th January, 1899, the black can buoy No. 23, situated about 2 cables southward of Strone Point, Holy Loch entrance, would be replaced by a gas buoy showing a white occulting light every six seconds (light, three seconds; eclipse, three seconds) moored in the same position.

Ile de Penfret Light—Character Altered.

The French Government has given further notice, that on 20th January, 1899, the light on Ile de Penfret, Glenan Islands, was altered to red flashing every five seconds, the light power being 2,000 becs Carcel = 20,000 candle power, and the temporary fixed light discontinued.
