Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Ladies to be presented be rery distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

Disinfection of Hides of Neat Cattle shipped to the United States.

.1899. Department Circular No. 11. Division of Customs.

Treasury Department, Office of the Secretary,

Washington, D.C., January 23, 1899. To Collectors of Customs and Others:

Department's Circular of November 22, 1895 (Synopis 16557), provides for the disinfection of hides of neat cattle, other than those which have been arsenic cured or dry salted, when imported from the countries of Europe, Asia; Africa, Australia, and South America, and further directs that hides of neat cattle, other than dry salted or arsenic cured, the product of the countries above named, will require disinfection as above whenever they shall be shipped via the perts of any other country; and that hide-, other than dry salted or arensic cured, the product of any country not named above, if trans-shipped and actually landed at ports in any of the countries named, will require disinfection.

It having been represented to the Department that great injury results to moist hides by the process of disinfection prescribed by said Circular, and as hides stripped from cattle at abattoirs are presumably in a condition not requiring disinfection, it is hereby directed that, so far as the countries of Norway, Sweden, and Great Britain are concerned, entry into the United States may be allowed of moist bides imported direct therefrom without d sinfection, provided the invoice shall contain the declaration of the shipper that the hides are the product of such countries and were stripped from the cattle in those countries, and that a certificate shall also be produced from the official veterinarian to the effect that the hides were taken from perfectly healthy cattle.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND). The Wild Birds Protection (County of Kent) Order, 1899.

Dated 25th February, 1899.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1896, and upon application by the County Council ci make the following Order:-

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Kent) Order, 1899."

Eggs.

All Eggs Protected in Certain Areas.

II. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' eggs is prohibited within the following areas in the county of Kent for the space of two years, from the 20th March, 1898:

1. So much of the Isle of Sheppey (including therein Elmley Island) as lies south of the road running from Queenborough, through Eastchurch,

to Warden Point.

2. An area bounded on the west by so much of the Sittingbourne and Sheerness Railway as lies between Kingsferry and the Sittingbourne Railway Station, and bounded on the south by the London Chatham and Dover Railway from Sittingbourne Railway Station to Whitstable Railway Station, and bounded on the east by the main road from Whitstable Stati n to the sea, and bounded on the north by the Swale and Whitstable Bay.

3. An area bounded on the west by the Minster and Deal branch of the South Eastern Railway from Minster Railway Station to Deal Railway Station, and bounded on the south by the road from Deal Railway Station to Deal Pier, and bounded on the east by the sea, and bounded on the north by the South Eastern Railway from

Minster Station to Ramsgate Station.

4. An area lying east and south of the main road from Walmer through Dover to Folkestone from the point where such road passes through the southern boundary of the Walmer Urban District to the point where such road enters the borough of Folkestone, such area being bounded on the east and south by the sea, and on the north by the Walmer Urban District, and on the south by the Borough of Folkestone.

5. An area lying south and west of the main road which runs from Appledore Railway Station through Snargate, Brenzett, and Old Romney, to New Romney Station, and thence to Littlestoneon-Sea, such area being bounded on the northwest by the Royal Military Canal from Appledore Railway Station to the Sussex Boundary, and bounded on the south-west by the Sussex Boundary, and on the south and east by the sea.

III. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within so much of the County of Kent as is not within the Metropoli an Police District: Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Buzzard, Fly Catchers (2), Goldfinch, Golden Oriole, Great Plover (Thick Knee), Hawfinch, Hen-harrier, Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Hoopoe, Kentish Plover, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Osprey, Owl (all species), Peregrine Falcon, Swallow, Swift, Turtle Dove, Wryneck.

#### Certain Eggs protected within the Metropolitan Police District.

IV. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within so much of the County of Kent as is within | Kewhurst, and the eastern boundary of the dis-

Extension of Close Time throughout the County. V. The time during which the killing and taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall, except as regards the Common Wild Duck, be varied throughout the County of Kent, so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 12th day of August in each year.

All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Parishes.

VI. During the period from the 13th day of August in any year to the last day of February following the taking or killing of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within so much of the County of Kent as is within the Metropolitan Police District, namely in the following parishes:—Beckenham, Bexley, Bromley, Chislehurst, Crayford, Down, Erith, Farnborough, Footscray, Hayes, Keston, St. Mary Cray, Mottingham, North Cray, Orpington, St. Paul's Cray, East Wickham and West Wickham.

VII. "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," shall apply within so much of the County of Kent as is not within the Metropolitan Police District to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act :- Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Buzzard, Chaffinch, Flycatchers, (2), Hawfinch, Hen-harrier, Hobby, Honey Buzzard, Kentish Plover, Kestrel, Martin, Merlin, Moorhen, Osprey, Peregrine Falcon, Swallow, Swift, Turtle Dove, Wryneck.
