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Jamaica, August 12.

**A**Bout April last His Excellency the Earl of Ingham, our Governour, having sent the *Swan* and *Guernsey* Frigats, the *Quaker* Ketch, a hired Merchant Man, and five Privateer Sloops of this Island, with 900 Men under the command of his Son Mr. O'Brian, to destroy the French Settlements upon the Coast of *Hispaniola*, and what Shipping could be found there; In their way they took a French Man of War of 10 Guns, and 100 Men, which they sent hither, and being come upon the Coast of *Hispaniola*, they found there 3 small Men of War and a Merchant Man of 22 Guns, with 2 other small Vessels, which they also took, and landing at *Nipo* upon *Hispaniola*, destroyed that Settlement of the French, having lost only 5 or 6 Men in this Expedition.

About the same time Information being given, that the *Calapach* Sloop belonging to this Island, lately taken by the French, and three other French Vessels, were cruising about Cape St. Antonio, to wait for some Ships bound homeward from this place, his Excellency sent some Vessels after them, who are since returned, and have brought with them the said Sloop and another Man of War Sloop, with 3 Prizes which had been taken from the English; So that the French, from the *Isla de Yaca* to *Port du Paix* upon *Hispaniola*, have only one *Barco Longo* with 10 Guns and 100 men left, of whom, in a late Encounter with one of our Vessels, the Captain and seven of his Men were killed.

**Rome, October 6.** The Cardinal *de Bozza* parted from hence on Wednesday last in his return to France; At his Audience of Leave two days before, he presented to the Pope a Letter from the French Bishops, who want his Bulls, wherein they make Excuses for what is past, and great Propositions of Respect for his Person and the See of Rome; But this Letter, as submissive as it is, does not satisfy the Pope, who insists upon a formal and publick Retraction of the four Propositions made in their Assembly in 1672, as also Reparation in the matter of the *Regale*. In the mean time, because the French make great Complaints against this Court for refusing to dispatch the said Bulls, whereby above 50 Bishopsicks remain vacant, and many millions of Souls are deprived of their Pastors, the Pope has referred the consideration of this matter to a Congregation of Cardinals, who met again on Tuesday last; And it's said, he intends to take the Advice of the whole College upon it. The Differences that lately happened at *Naples* about the Inquisition, has made the Pope recal the Bishop of *Cava*, who was Inquisitor there, and the Authorities he had are put into the hands of the Archbishop of *Naples*. On Thursday last dyed Cardinal *Frederick Colonna*, in the 65th Year of his Age; He was Creature of *Innocent X.* and by his Death has left a sixth Place void in the College of Cardinals. The Marquis *de Canossa*, Envoy from the Duke of *Mantua*, has not yet had Audience of the Pope, who, it's believed, defers it, till he has an Answer from the Emperor to the Letter he lately writ about the Winter Quarters the Imperial Troops pretend to take in *Austria*.

**Venice, October 12.** By two Vessels from the *Levant* we have Advice, that the Captain-General *Mocenigo* was returned with the Fleet of this State to *Napoli di Romania*, having left Signior *Delfino* to cruise with a Squa-

dron of Men of War before the Mouth of the *Dardanelli*. At the *Lido* are arrived this week 1000 new raised men, who will be sent with the next Convoy to the *Morocco*. There has lately happened an Earthquake at *Aquila* in the Kingdom of *Naples*, which threw down a great many Houses; And the Town of *Salerno* has suffered very much by great Floods of Water that came down from the Mountains.

**Lemberg in Poland, October 4.** The last week we had Advice, that the Castellan of *Chelm*, who was detached towards *Budziack* with 4000 Cossacks and 2000 Poles, being advanced near to *Niemcew*, was informed that 14000 Tartars were on their march to attack them, upon which our Troops made a kind of a Fortification with their Wagons, and put themselves into a good posture of Defence, that after a fight of 3 hours they repulsed the Enemy, and killed about 3000 of them, with the loss only of 2 or 300 men on our side. The Tartars retired, but being afterwards reinforced, came and besieged the Cossacks in their Camp, who considering how much superior the Enemy were to them in number, retreated in the night, forcing their way through the quarter of the Tartars that would have opposed them; In which occasion divers of the Enemy were likewise killed. The Letters from the King's Camp near *Perewetta* in *Moldavia* of the 15th past told us, that the Tartars having sent back the Convoy they pretended to conduct to *Caminnice*, advanced within sight of our Army to destroy the Forage, and thereby deprive them of Subsistence, and on the 13th they attack'd our Vanguard commanded by the Prince of *Lubomirski*, but met with so brave a resistance, that they were not only beaten back with great loss, but a strong Reinforcement being sent to Prince *Lubomirski*, he pressed so hard upon the Enemy, (who are said to have been above 30000 strong) that he forced them to quit their Camp in great disorder. And by Letters from the Camp of the 20th we understand, that the Army decamped the 18 from *Perewetta*, and having passed the River *Prut*, advanced on the 20th to the River *Dzawa*, over which the King of *Poland* had caused Bridges to be laid, finding at the same time a Detachment of 2000 men towards *Szeczyn*.

**Vienna, October 18.** The Letters from *Hungary* give an account, that the Imperial Army was come before *Great Waradin*; That General *Hoesler*, who was lately set at Liberty by *Teczel*, was arrived in the Camp; And that Prince *Lewis* had sent back Count *Masfick* to meet the English and Dutch Ambassadors, who were coming with the Grand Visier to *Belgrade*, and to fix the Place and Time for the sitting on foot the Treaty of Peace. At which, the Count *de Kiniki* Great Chancellor of *Bohemia*, and the Count *de Strattman* Great Chancellor of the Court, are appointed to assist on the part of the Emperor, and they, together with the Ambassador of *Prussia*, have accordingly Orders to repair forthwith to *Hungary*. From *Esbeck* we are told, that the Duke of *Croy* was marched into *Sclavonia*; That the Count *de Hofbirken* had passed the *Sava* with a Body of Horse; And that he was to be joynd by the Croats in order to force *Enterprize* on that side.

**Frankfort, October 24.** The Swedish Troops, who passed the *Main* the 22d instant near this place, continue still in the Villages hereabouts. The Regiment of *Bibera* is marching to *Wunze* to reinforce that Garrison.

**Colone, October 26.** The 3 *Brandenburg* Regiments of Horse, Commanded by Major General *Dumrie*, 1500 within 2 hours of this place. And yesterday the Count *de Lippe* arrived with the Troops of *Hesse*, who come
