No. 302.—ITALY—WEST COAST.

Nisida and Ischia Mole Lights—Alteration in Character.

THE Italian Government has given notice, that on and after 15th May, 1899, the following alteration would be made in the colour of the lights exhibited on Nisida and Ischia Moles, but in other respects the lights would remain as before:—

(a.) The colour of Nisida Mole Light would be changed from red to green.

Approximate position, lat. 40° 48' N., long. 14° 10' E.

(b.) The colour of the flashes exhibited from the light on the Mole Head, Port Bagno, Ischia, would be altered from red to green.

Approximate position, lat. 40° 45' N., long. 13° 57' E.

No. 303.—UNITED STATES—NEW YORK
Sandy Hook Light-Vessel Temporarily Replaced.

THE United States Government has given notice, that on or about 17th May, 1899, the Light-vessel No. 51, moored off Sandy Hook, eastward of Gedney Channel, would be temporarily replaced by Relief Light-vessel No. 11.

Sandy Hook temporary light-vessel shows two white fixed lights, one at each mast-head, elevated 40 and 50 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from distances of 11 and 12 miles respectively.

Light-vessel No. 11 has two masts, but no bowsprit, a black cage at each mast-head; the hull is straw colour, with "Relief No. 11" on sides, in black letters.

During thick or foggy weather a bell will be sounded for three seconds every fifteen seconds,
