**Borough of Blackpool.**

**NOTICE** is hereby given, that the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, acting by the Council as the Local Authority in this behalf, did on the fifth day of June, 1899, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations:—

**Borough of Blackpool.**

**BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS** made by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool, with respect to tramways and portions of tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by them.

The Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, acting by the Council, hereinafter called the Corporation, under the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Blackpool Improvement Act, 1896, do hereby make the following Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to the tramways and portions of tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by the Corporation.

For preventing the commission of any nuisance in or upon any carriage, or in or against any premises belonging to them.

For regulating the travelling in or upon any carriage belonging to them.

*Extent of Bye-Laws.*

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

*Passengers getting on and off.*

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a closed carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, and every passenger shall enter or depart from an open carriage by the footboard of such carriage, and not otherwise.

*Smoking.*

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any closed carriage or on either platform thereof.

*Musical Instruments.*

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

*Intoxicated or Infected Persons.*

5. A person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any infectious or contagious disease, shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

*Committing Nuisance.*

6. No person shall swear or use any obscene, indecent, or offensive language whilst entering or mounting, or whilst in or upon any carriage, or expectorate or commit any nuisance in or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

*Wilful Damage.*

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, or linings of any carriage, or remove or deface any number, plate, printed, painted, or other notice or writing, or

any advertisement in or on any carriage, or mark, break, or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage, or (unless a servant of the Corporation), touch, handle, or interfere with any machine, apparatus, or appliance in, under, upon, or about any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

*Offensive Clothing, &c.*

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter, mount, or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from entering, mounting, or remaining in or upon any carriage, and shall not enter, mount, or be or remain in or upon any carriage or any part thereof, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any carriage, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

*Fares.*

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for the journey, or under such regulations as to tickets, or checks, or payment into a money box, or other system as the Corporation, with the approval of the Board of Trade, may from time to time determine.

*Production of Tickets.*

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, by any servant of the Corporation, either deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

*Artisans' Special Carriage.*

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament or Provisional Orders relating to the tramways and portions of tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket or any special carriage intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

*Luggage.*

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, or on the rear or conductor's platform, or in a compartment specially set apart for the conveyance of parcels, and not elsewhere on any carriage. The conductor may decline to take into or upon any carriage any luggage which from its size or otherwise is not suitable for conveyance in or upon such carriage.

*Standing on Steps or Platforms.*

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation, shall be permitted to travel on the steps, footboards, or platforms of any carriage, or to stand either on the roof or in the interior, or to sit on any rail or any part of any carriage not intended for passengers, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.
