2. Tous les bâtiments arrivant du ports contaminés de la peste seront dirigés à Souline, où ils seront soumis à la visite médicale et à la désinfection pendant six jours, au large, et leur entrée dans le port, ne sera permise qu'après constation de l'état sanitaire satisfaisant de l'équipage entier, des passagers et du bâtiment, s'il y avait des cas suspects à bord, le délai d'observation sera prolongé :

3. L'entrée dans le pays des marchandises suivantes provenant de tout l'Egypte ainsi que des localités suspectes, est interdite :

Fruits, légumes, fromages, viande séchée, laines, soieries brutes, tapis, linge et vêtements usés, chiffons et hardes, même s'ils étaient mis en ballots sacs usés, cordes, cordages usés, peaux vertes, cornes et cheveux humains ou autres.

4. Les lettres, la correspondance, les imprimés, les journaux, les papiers d'affaires, les colis postaux, seront soumis à la désinfection au fournat.

5. Seront soumis à une observation de dix jours, en ce qui concerne l'état sanitaire, les passagers arrivant des ports maritimes, à Constantza, Fulcea, Galatz, Braila et Giurgiu et qui restent dans le pays, ainsi que ceux qui traversent le pays, pendant leur trajet.

6. Les bâtiments du service maritime roumain pendant tout le temps que le pays serait menacé par la peste, auront chacun à bord une étuve et un médecin, qui sera chargé de l'exécution de la désinfection, de la surveillance sanitaire de l'équipage et des passagers—les bâtiments, pendant le temps susmentionné, ne recevront pas à transporter les marchandises indiquées au No. 3 provenant de tout l'Egypte, ainsi que des localités suspectes ; les marchandises indiquées au No. 4 seront soumises à la désinfection.
