Drills performed in first year by recruits, beyond the nineteen required for efficiency, may be counted towards the second year's efficiency, but a minimum of nine drills, including the Inspection, three being drills of the whole corps, must be performed in the second year.

Two drills in addition must be performed in all cases where Volunteers join after the Inspection, or are absent from the Inspection with leave of the Commanding Officer, or through sickness duly certified.

The Inspection may be reckoned as one of the drills of the whole corps, and attendance at a brigade drill or a review may be counted as a troop drill.
