Oporto declared infected, other Portuguese ports, including Madeira, Azores, suspected, also countries not taking sufficient precautions. Ships from any of above having sanitary inspector on board get pratique after inspector (sic), ten days from infected, five from suspected ports. St. Vincent not mentioned."

Withdrawal of Swine-Fever (Movement) Order of 1898.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order, the District of the Local Authority mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall cease to be subject to the Swine-Fever (Movement) Order of 1898.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 29TH AUGUST 1899.)

BRECONSHIRE (MUZZLING OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1899.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extent and Enforcement.

1. This Order applies to and shall be in force in the part of a District of a Local Authority mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be enforced by the Local Authority of such District.

Muzzling of Dogs.

2.—(1.) No dog shall be allowed to be in or on any public place unless such dog is efficiently

muzzled with a wire cage muzzle so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent such dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

(2.) Provided that the provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a.) packs of hounds or greyhounds while being exercised or used for sporting purposes, or other sporting dogs while being used for sporting purposes, or any dogs while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin, and in every case in charge of competent persons.

(b.) dogs while being taken to or from exhibitions, shows, or other places if such dogs are confined in boxes, cages, crates, baskets, or hampers so constructed as to render it impossible for such dogs while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Unmuzzled Dogs.

3.—(1.) Any dog found in or on any public place without being muzzled in manner prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows :

(i.) If the dog is diseased or suspected or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii.) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii.) For prohibiting or restricting the use of locomotives on any specified highway in the county on account of the highway being crowded or unfitted for locomotive traffic, or of the inconvenience caused to inhabitants, or of any other reasonable cause; and

For regulating the use of locomotives and of waggons drawn by locomotives on any highway; and

For prohibiting or restricting the use of a locomotive on any specified bridge in the county

if the Council are satisfied that such bridge is unsuited for locomotive traffic, or that such use would be attended with damage to the bridge or danger to the public.

1. Throughout these bye-laws the expression "the Council" means the County Council, and the expression "the County" means the Administrative County of Lancaster, and all municipal boroughs therein having, according to the census of 1881, a population of less than 10,000 inhabitants.

2. A person in charge of a locomotive on any highway shall not use the locomotive to draw more than three unloaded waggons, with or without any waggon solely used for carrying water for such locomotive.

Provided that this prohibition shall not apply in any case where, on application to the Council for permission to use a locomotive on any specified journey to draw more than three unloaded waggons, with or without any waggon solely used as aforesaid, such Council may grant such permission.

3. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to remain stationary on any part of a highway for more than twenty minutes at any one time.

Provided that this bye-law shall not be deemed to apply in any case where the stopping of the locomotive for a longer period than twenty minutes

(a.) is necessary in order to enable the person using the locomotive to comply with the requirements of any statutory provision or bye-law for the time being in force for the regulation of the use of locomotives; or

(b.) is rendered necessary by accident or other unavoidable cause.

4. Where for a continuous length exceeding one hundred yards a highway comprises a carriage-way or cart-way of a width less than sixteen feet, a person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to enter upon the carriage-way or cart-way unless and until

(a.) he shall have ascertained that throughout the length aforesaid the carriage-way or cart-way is clear of vehicles; and

(b.) a person accompanying the locomotive shall have preceded the locomotive to a sufficient distance to warn the drivers of vehicles of the approach of the locomotive.

5. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to remain stationary on any highway so that any wheel of the locomotive rests on any bridge, arch, or culvert, or within ten feet from the face of the abutment of any bridge, arch, or culvert.

Provided that this prohibition shall not be deemed to apply in any case

(a.) where, in pursuance of the statutory provision in that behalf, a locomotive may be required to be instantly stopped; or

(b.) where the stopping of a locomotive may be rendered necessary by accident, or other unavoidable cause.

6. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not use the locomotive on any of the bridges of which the description appears in the Schedule hereunto appended, and which are bridges whereon the use of locomotives is hereby prohibited on account of such one or more of the causes mentioned in such schedule as is or are therein specified in relation to the several bridges.

7. A person in charge of a locomotive on any highway who may be required by any officer of the Council or police constable, duly authorized

in that behalf, to stop the locomotive, for the purpose of enabling the officer or constable to ascertain by examination whether any provision of any statute or bye-law applicable to the locomotive has been or is duly complied with, shall forthwith cause the locomotive, if in motion, to stop, and shall not cause or suffer the locomotive, to be again set in motion until such time shall have elapsed as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of such examination.

The person in charge of the locomotive shall, in connection with such examination, give all reasonable assistance that may be demanded by

the officer or constable requiring the locomotive to be stopped.

8. From and after the date of the confirmation of these bye-laws, the bye-laws with respect to locomotives which were made by the Justices of the county of Lancaster on the 29th day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and were confirmed by the Local Government Board on the 31st day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and on the 21st day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, shall be repealed.
