ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 19TH OCTOBER 1899.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1896.

2. The said Area, so long as it continues to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, shall not be subject to the Swine-Fever (Movement) Order of 1898.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture have hereunto set their Official Seal this nineteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

Sunken Wreck in Swash Channel Marked by a Gas Buoy.

THE United States Government has given notice, dated 26th September, 1899, that the wreck of a three-masted schooner lies sunk in Swash Channel, New York Lower Bay, about three-quarters of a mile southerly from Romer Shoal Lighthouse.

From the wreck, which has her masts standing, Romer Shoal Lighthouse bears N. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., distant 8 cables, and Old Orchard Shoal Lighthouse W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

A gas buoy, painted in red and black horizontal stripes, and showing a fixed white light, is moored in 22 feet water, about 100 feet south-eastward of the wreck.

Upper Traverse Lightship Discontinued, and Temporary Lights Shown from Lighthouse in Course of Construction.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 462 of 1899:—

The Canadian Government has given further notice, that from and after 1st October, 1899, the lightship at the upper end of the Traverse of St. Roch would be removed, and the lights heretofore exhibited from her will be shown from the pier of the new lighthouse in course of construction until the lighthouse is completed and the permanent light is exhibited.

The pier of the lighthouse is now 4 feet above high water springs, and a shelter shed has been erected on it.

One light will be shown from the up-stream and one from the down-stream end of the shed. Both lights are fixed white lights, shown from anchor lens lanterns; the up-stream light is elevated 27 feet and the down-stream light 21 feet above high water. Both lights will be visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles in all directions.

Amended Position of Known Shoals and New Shoals Discovered.

THE Rural District Council of Kingswinford, the Undertakers for the purpose of the Kingswinford Electric Lighting Order, 1898, hereby give notice that with the consent of the Board of Trade they propose by deed to be approved by the Board of Trade to transfer their powers, duties, liabilities, and works to the Midland Electric Corporation for Power Distribution Limited, hereinafter called the Company.

Section 7 as to purchase and use of lands.

Section 28 as to remuneration of electric inspectors.

Section 52 as to the application of revenue.

Section 53 as to the application of capital moneys.

Section 54 so far as relates to the authentication of any notice, order, or document by the Council.

Section 68, incorporating section 265 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

(b.) Annual accounts before publication are to be audited by such person as the Board of Trade may appoint.

(c.) If after expiration of seven years from date of transfer Council make representation to Board of Trade that prices or methods of charge ought to be altered Board may make order varying prices or methods of charge.

(d.) Where Council are givers of notice under section 12 of Order they may require Company to give security for repayment of expenses incurred by them in complying with the requisition or to deposit with Council £150 as security to Council for repayment of expenditure incurred by them in complying with the requisition.

(e.) Company may acquire for purposes of Undertaking such lands as they think necessary.

(f.) The Company shall commence the works necessary for installing the electric light throughout the Council's district within twelve months of the approval of deed of transfer by Board of Trade, and works shall be proceeded with continuously and with all possible despatch.

(g.) Where execution of works will involve breaking up of street or bridge Company shall serve notice on Council describing proposed works and Council may require amendments reasonably necessary.

(h.) Company shall not place any street boxes above ground except with consent of Council in addition to other consent required by Order.

(i.) Council may prescribe hours during which Company may have access to street boxes.

(j.) Requisition requiring Company to lay down distributing mains throughout any street in which Council have control of public lamps may be made by Council, but such requisition shall not be binding upon Company unless Council give written undertaking to take for three years a supply of energy for lighting the public lamps in such street.

(k.) Company upon receiving notice from Council requiring them to supply energy to any public lamps within 75 yards from any distributing mains of Company shall give supply to such lamps in such quantities as Council may require.

(l.) Prices to be charged by Company for energy supplied to public lamps, and prices charged to ordinary consumers shall be settled by agreement between Council and Company, or in case of difference by arbitration.

(m.) Company shall supply the Council with

copy map of area of supply as provided in section 51 of Order.

(n.) Copy of all regulations made by Board of Trade under Order or Electric Lighting Acts affecting the Undertaking shall, on being printed, be served on Council.

(o.) The Company is not to place any electric line above ground, except as provided in section 6 of the Order, without the consent of the Council, in addition to that of the Board of Trade.

(p.) The Company is not to consent to, or concur in, the revocation of the Order under section 57 of the Order without the approval in writing of the Council.

(q.) The Company, without the approval in writing of the Board of Trade and the consent of the Council, is not to transfer the Undertaking.

(r.) In case the Company, in the opinion of an arbitrator appointed by the Board of Trade, makes default in the performance of its obligations, the Company may be required to sell the Undertaking to the Council on such terms as the arbitrator may determine.

(s.) Company shall not be prevented from borrowing money on security of mortgages of Undertaking and approval of Board of Trade shall not be necessary for validity of such mortgages.

The Locomotives Act, 1898.

Administrative County of Norfolk.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Norfolk County Council have made the following Bye-laws, and that the said County Council intend to apply to the Local Government Board for confirmation of the same, viz.:—

Bye-laws made by the County Council of Norfolk with respect to Locomotives in the Administrative County of Norfolk for prohibiting or restricting the use of Locomotives on any specified highway in the County on account of the highway being crowded or unfitted for locomotive traffic, or of the inconvenience caused to inhabitants, or of any other reasonable cause; and for regulating the use of locomotives and of waggons drawn by locomotives on any highway; and for prohibiting or restricting the use of a locomotive on any specified bridge in the county, if the Council are satisfied that such bridge is unsuited for locomotive traffic, or that such use would be attended with damage to the bridge or danger to the public.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the expression "the Council" means the County Council of Norfolk.

2. These Bye-laws shall extend and apply to all parts of the Administrative County of Norfolk, except the borough of King's Lynn, which is a borough containing, according to the census of 1881, a population of ten thousand or upwards.

3. A person in charge of a locomotive shall

not use the locomotive on any of the highways of which the description appears in the Schedule hereunto appended, and which are highways whereon the use of locomotives is hereby prohibited on account of such highways being unfitted for locomotive traffic.

Clomer...	Church-street (from Mount-street to Garden-street)
Do. ...	West-street (from Garden-street to Prince of Wales-road)

4. A person in charge of a locomotive on any highway shall not use the locomotive to draw more than three unloaded waggons, with or without any waggon solely used for carrying water for such locomotive.

Provided that this prohibition shall not apply in any case, where, on application to the Council, or so far as regards any highway situated in a municipal borough, to the Council of that borough, for permission to use a locomotive on any specified journey to draw more than three unloaded waggons, with or without any waggon solely used as aforesaid, the Council, or the Council of such borough as the case may be, may grant such permission.

5. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to remain stationary on any part of a highway for more than thirty minutes at any one time.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not be deemed to apply in any case where the stopping of the locomotive for a longer period than thirty minutes

(a) is necessary in order to enable the person using the locomotive to comply with the requirements of any statutory provision or Bye-law for the time being in force for the regulation of the use of locomotives; or

(b) is rendered necessary by accident, or other unavoidable cause.

6. Where for a continuous length exceeding one hundred yards a highway comprises a carriageway or cartway of a width less than sixteen feet, a person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to enter upon the carriageway or cartway unless and until

(a) he shall have ascertained that throughout the length aforesaid the carriageway or cartway is clear of vehicles; and

(b) a person accompanying the locomotive shall have preceded the locomotive to a sufficient distance to warn the drivers of vehicles of the approach of the locomotive.

7. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to remain stationary on any highway so that any wheel of the locomotive rests on any bridge, arch or culvert, or within ten feet from the face of the abutment of any bridge, arch or culvert.

Provided that this prohibition shall not be deemed to apply in any case

(a) where, in pursuance of the statutory provision in that behalf, a locomotive may be required to be instantly stopped; or

(b) where the stopping of a locomotive may be rendered necessary by accident, or other unavoidable cause.

8. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not use the locomotive on any of the bridges of which the description appears in the Schedule hereunto appended, and which are bridges whereon the use of locomotives is hereby prohibited, the Council being satisfied that such use would be attended with damage to the bridges.

9. A person in charge of a locomotive on any highway who may be required by any officer of the Council, police constable, or other person duly authorized by the Council in that behalf to stop the locomotive for the purpose of enabling such officer, constable, or other person to ascertain by examination whether any provision of any statute or Bye-law applicable to the locomotive has been or is duly complied with, shall forthwith cause the locomotive, if in motion, to stop, and shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to be again set in motion until such time shall have elapsed as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of such examination.

The person in charge of the locomotive shall, in connection with such examination, give all reasonable assistance that may be demanded by the officer, constable, or other person requiring the locomotive to be stopped.
